Intense heatwave claims 8 lives in Rajasthan, Barmer hottest in country at 48.8-degree C

SCORCHING HEAT

- The temperature of the MP is continuously increasing. Guna was the hottest with a maximum temperature of 46.6 degrees Celsius. At the same time, the temperature in almost half of the state is more than 44 degrees Celsius and the heat waves are scorching.
- The IMD has issued yellow alerts in Maharashtra's 23 districts for the next two days including Dhule, Akola, Amravati, Bhandara and Nagpur with Akola having yellow alerts for the entire week. The IMD report states

"Thunderstorm Lightning with Gusty Wind Speed Reaching 3040 Kmph Most Likely to Occur at Isolated Places" in its city forecast reports.

Intense heatwave claimed eight lives in four districts of Rajasthan -Barmer, Balotra, Jalore, and Bhilwara -- as the maximum temperature at many places in the state shot up to 46-48-degree Celcius, with Barmer at 48.8 emerging as the hottest place in the country on

According to the Met department, the maximum temperature soared to over 47-degree Celsius at seven cities in the state on Thursday.

The heatwave will intensify in the next two days, said the Jaipur



Meteorological Centre, adding that the mercury will reduce slightly after May 28. Meanwhile, two persons died due to extreme heat in Balotra.

Mularam (55) was working in the fields when his health condition deteriorated due to the heat. His family members rushed him to a hospital

DELHI SIZZLES AT 47 DEGREES CELSIUS

New Delhi: As temperatures continue to soar in the national capital, doctors on Tuesday advised caution against prolonged exposure to heat.

The India Meteorological Department (IMD) has forecast a heatwave and hot and humid weather warning for the next seven days in New Delhi.The maximum temperature will range between 44 and 47 degrees Celsius.On Monday, the national capital's maximum temperature reached 47.4 degrees Celsius -- the highest in the country. Meanwhile, the Delhi government has ordered an immediate closure of schools given the rising heatwaves.

A high body temperature may lead to nausea and vomiting, poor concentration and drowsiness, cramps, throbbing headache, confusion, dizziness, palpitation, fast strong pulse, and loss of consciousness, Dr G. J. Singh from Yashoda Super Specialty Hospital, Kaushambi, told reporter.

The experts advised staying indoors during extreme heat waves, wearing light clothes, keeping proper hydration, eating good and balanced food at home, and avoiding meals from outside.

were also reported from Bhilwara and Jalore districts. After Barmer, Phalodi recorded the maximum temperature on Thursday at 48.6-degree Celcius, followed by Fatehpur (47.6), Jaisalmer (47.5), Jodhpur (47.4), Jalore (47.3), Kota (47.2), Churu (47), Dungarpur (46.8), Chhitorgarh (45.5), and Jaipur (44), among others.

A red alert has been sounded in most parts of Rajasthan for the next three days.

SEVERE CYCLONIC STORM LIKELY TO HIT **BENGAL COAST ON SUNDAY MIDNIGHT**

New Delhi: India Meteorological Department on Friday said that a severe cyclonic storm is very likely to hit the West Bengal and Bangladesh coasts between Sagar Island and Khepupara around Sunday (26th May) midnight.

IMD attributed the cyclonic storm to a depression formed over central Bay of Bengal which is continuing to move northward.

Continuing to move nearly northward, it is very likely to cross Bangladesh and adjoining West Bengal coasts between Sagar Island and Khepupara around 26th May midnight as a severe cyclonic storm, it added.IMD has predicted light to moderate rainfall at most places with heavy to very heavy rainfall at isolated places over coastal districts of West Bengal and adjoining districts of North Odisha on 26th & Damp; 27th May and isolated extremely heavy rainfall likely over coastal districts of West Bengal on 26th May. Bangladesh MP Murdered By Illegal Immigrant Who Skinned Him, Chopped Up Body

Bangladesh MP, believed to have been murdered in Kolkata, was skinned, chopped up in an apartment and disposed of in several plastic packets across the city, investigations have revealed. The MP, Anwarul Azim Anar, had been missing since May 14, two days after he arrived in Kolkata.

The West Bengal CID (Criminal Investigation Department) has made a significant breakthrough in the investigation after the arrest of Jihad Hawladar, an illegal immigrant from Bangladesh, who lived in Mumbai. According to CID sources, Jihad Hawladar has confessed to his involvement in the murder and dismemberment of the



The revelations are nothing short of chilling. Hawladar allegedly told cops that after killing Anar, the group proceeded to skin the body, remove all the flesh, and mince it to obliterate any possibility of identification. The remains were then packed into plastic bags, with the bones cut into small pieces. These packets were transported and disposed of across Kolkata, the suspect allegedly said.

15 dead in rain-related incidents in Tamil Nadu

t least 15 people have died in Tamil Nadu between May 16 and May 22 in rain-related incidents, an official said on Thursday.

In a statement, the Tamil Nadu State Revenue and Disaster Management department said that three persons died in Krishnagiri, Salem and Cuddalore districts in the last 24 hours due to thunder, lightning and wall collapse. Also, 13 cattle deaths were reported while 40 houses and huts were damaged in various parts of the state. The statement mentioned that 4,385 hectares of crops have submerged in rain water. Tamil Nadu received an average of 1.58 cm of rain in the last 24 hours with Nilgiris recording the maximum rainfall of 6.15 cm. The weather department has issued an advisory to fishermen not to venture into the sea. District collectors have been instructed to



take all precautionary measures. An official said that 10 SDRF teams of 296 members have been stationed in Kannivakumari, Coimbatore, Tirunelveli and Nilgiris districts.

Tourists have been advised to take precautions and to avoid travelling till May 24 in the state. The official also said that State and District Emergency Response Centres were functioning round the clock and additional officials have been deployed to monitor the sit-



Delhi court on Friday convicted Narmada Bachao Andolan (NBA) activist Medha Patkar in a defamation case filed by Delhi Lieutenant Governor (L-G) V.K. Saxena.

This marks an important development in a prolonged legal battle that has spanned over two decades between the two -- Patkar and Saxena, who was also the Chairman of the Khadi and Village Industries Commission (KVIC).

The defamation case stems from a series of legal disputes that began in 2000. At that time, Patkar filed a suit against Saxena for publishing advertisements that she claimed were defamatory towards her and the NBA.

Saxena was then the head of the Ahmedabadbased NGO, National Council for Civil Liberties. In response, Saxena filed two defamation cases against Patkar -- one for alleged derogatory remarks

she made about him during a television appearance, while the second case involved a press statement issued by Patkar. Metropolitan Magistrate Raghav Sharma of Saket Courts noted that Patkar made and published imputation that the complainant had visited Malegao, praised NBA, had issued a cheque of Rs 40,000, which came from Lal Bhai Group, and that "he was a coward and not a patriot". Magistrate Sharma noted: "The accused by publishing the above imputation intended to harm or knew or had reason to believe that such imputation will harm complainant's reputation." Advocates Gajinder Kumar, Kiran Jai, Chandra Shekhar, Drishti, and Somya Arya appeared for the L-G, while advocate Sridevi Pannikar represented Patkar in the court.While the judge passed an order for her conviction, he made certain observations. Magistrate Sharma said that reputation is one of the most valuable assets a person can

possess, as it affects both personal and professional relationships and can significantly impact an individual's standing in the society. Regarding Patkar's statements calling the L-G a coward, and not a patriot, and alleging his involvement in hawala transactions, the judge said they were not only defamatory per se, but also crafted to incite nega-

Vladimir Putin Ready For Ukraine Ceasefire On Current Frontlines: Report

Russian President Vladimir Putin is ready to halt the war in Ukraine with a negotiated ceasefire that recognises the current battlefield lines, four Russian sources told Reuters, saying he is prepared to fight on if Kyiv and the West do not respond. Three of the sources, familiar with discussions in Putin's entourage, said the veteran Russian leader had expressed frustration to a small group of advisers about what he views as Western-backed attempts to stymie negotiations and Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskiy's decision to rule out talks. "Putin can fight for as long as it takes, but Putin is also ready for a ceasefire - to freeze the war," said another of the four, a senior Russian source who has worked with Putin and has knowledge of top level conver-



sations in the Kremlin. He, like the others cited in this story, spoke on condition of anonymity given the matter's sensitivity. For this account, Reuters spoke to a total of five people who work with or have worked with Putin at a senior level in the political and business worlds. The fifth source did not comment on freezing the war at the current frontlines. Putin's spokesman Dmitry Peskov, in response to a request for comment, said the Kremlin chief had repeatedly made clear Russia was open to dialogue to achieve its goals, saying the country did not want "eternal

JLR To Make In India - Range Rover, Range Rover Sport Prices To Fall 22%

ata Motors owned Jaguar Land Rover will start producing its Range Rover and Range Rover Sport in India, marking a first for the iconic models in their 54-year long history, to be rolled out from a country outside of the UK.

Till now the two models were only produced in Jaguar Land Rover's Solihull plant in the UK and then exported to around 121 markets globally, including India.

With enhanced localisation, the Marquee British brand aims to make the two products better in terms of pricing to cater to a larger set of customers in India.The price of two models is set to come down in the range of 18-22 per cent with the local production.Tata Group Chairman N Chandrasekaran lauded Tata Sons Chairman Emeritus Ratan Tata for bringing the JLR brand to the Tata



family 15 years ago.

...the Range Rover will be manufactured right here in India is just a super feeling..its a very very special moment and I feel proud.." he said.

He noted that the company would see an increase in sales in the country going ahead."We will sell more, I am very confident that it's going to be a great journey from here,

India's growth momentum to continue in April-March quarter of 2024-25: FinMin report

he Indian economy closed the financial year 2023-24 strongly despite strong external headwinds, and early indications suggest that the growth momentum will continue during the current April-June quarter of 2024-25, according to a Finance Ministry report released on Friday.

"The emerging robust trends in key high-frequency indicators of growth like GST collections, e-way bills, electronic toll collections, sale of vehicles, purchasing managers' indices, and the value and number of digital transactions attest to the growing strength of the economy," the Finance Ministry said in its monthly economic review for April. The industrial and service sectors of the Indian economy are performing well, backed by brisk domestic demand and partially by

tentative external demand. This can benefit India's manufacturing firms as part of the China Plus One strategy.

The EXIM Bank of India has forecast that merchandise exports will post a double-digit growth in Q1 of FY25, the report pointed out.

The report expects domestic manufacturing to receive stronger export orders due to improved economic activity and consumer sentiment in Europe and a steady US economy. It cites an uptick in India's exports in April to support the point.

It admits that geopolitical tensions and volatility in global commodity prices, especially of petroleum products, present substantial challenges. "Nonetheless, the expectation is that the macro-economic buffers will help the Indian economy navigate these challenges reasonably smoothly," the report added.



NAXALISM WILL RETURN TO BIHAR IF CPI(ML) WINS: HM SHAH

nion Home Minister, Amit Shah, on Friday said that Naxalism would resurface in Bihar if the CPI(ML) won Lok Sabha elections in the state.

The CPI(ML) is contesting in the three Lok Sabha constituencies of Arrah, Karakat and Nalanda as an ally of the Grand Alliance in Bihar.

While addressing a rally in Ramna ground in Arrah city in Bihar on Friday, HM Shah said, "Lalu Prasad Yadav has fielded CPI(ML) in Arrah and if its candidate wins even by mistake then Naxalism will resurface and bullets will be fired again."

"I want to ask the people of Arrah if they want farmlands to be occupied, kidnapping, and looting here. If the CPI(ML) wins, all this will happen here again," HM Shah said.

"Under the leadership of Prime Minister Narendra Modi, Naxalism was wiped out from Bihar, Jharkhand, Odisha, Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra, Telangana and Andhra Pradesh.



"I want to appeal to the people to give us more than 400 seats in the Lok Sabha and we will finish Naxalism in Chhattisgarh too in the third term of the Modi government," he said.

He also targeted the RJD, Congress and TMC on the OBC quota issue.

"Can't Go By Sentiment": Supreme Court Junks Manipur Violence Petition

The Supreme Court said it cannot go by sentiments and has to act as per law, as it refused to entertain a petition seeking contempt action for alleged non-compliance with the top court's order on the protection of properties of people displaced during the Manipur violence.

A vacation bench of Justices Bela M Trivedi and Pankaj Mithal said it was not satisfied with the contention that a case of contempt was made out against the respondents, including Manipur's Chief Secretary, and the petitioners can take recourse to remedy which may be available under the law.

Additional Solicitor General Aishwarya Bhati, appearing for Manipur, told the bench that no case of contempt was made out, and the state and the Centre are on the ground doing everything they can to assuage public concerns.

"The effort is to keep the pot boiling which is very unfortunate," Bhati said, adding that the state was duty-bound to protect all and can file an updated status report on the issue.

The top court was hearing a petition claiming the respondents committed contempt of its September 25, 2023 order on protecting the properties of those displaced during the ethnic conflict."Who according to you are in contempt?" the bench asked the petitioner's counsel who said the Chief Secretary and others are. "They are not the encroachers," the bench shot back. When the advocate said the

petitioners are living outside Manipur and are not in a position to go anywhere near Imphal, the bench said, "That does not mean that notice be issued against the Chief Secretary".

Bhati referred to last year's order which said Manipur and the Centre have a week to respond to the directions, including ensuring protection of properties of displaced persons and preventing their encroachment.

"We had filed a status report. We can file an updated status report," she said, adding the state is duty-bound to protect its citizens and their properties. "Manipur is still in a situation of uneasy calm as we speak. There are conflicting views and the state and central government are trying to assuage everyone," Bhati said. When the counsel for the petitioners claimed that their properties were looted in the presence of the police and they could place those videos before the court, the law officer objected to it and said wild allegations were being made.

Former BRS MLA booked for alleged land grab, criminal intimidation

Jeevan Reddy has been booked by police for allegedly grabbing a businessman's land.

Chevella police registered the case against the Bharat Rashtra Samithi (BRS) leader on a complaint by businessman Sama Damodhar Reddy, who alleged that the former MLA and his family members grabbed his land at Erlapally village of Ranga Reddy district.

The complainant told police that he purchased 20 acres and 20 guntas of land on the outskirts of Erlapally village in 2002 and constructed a function hall. Since then he has been in possession of the land.

The businessman alleged that last year former MLA

Jeevan Reddy, his wife A. Rajitha and mother A. Rajubai, who own the land adjacent to his land, occupied half of his property, demolished the function hall and constructed a new build-

The complainant said when he entered his land, D. Suresh, a watchman and 'Bihar, Punjab gang' members and others obstructed them and threatened them with dire consequences.

Damodhar Reddy said when he went to his land again on May 22, 2024, members of gangs from other states didn't allow him into the land and threatened him with dire consequences, brandishing deadly weapons.

Based on a complaint, the police registered a case against Jeevan Reddy under various sections of the Indian Penal Code (IPC) at Chevella police station under the Cyberabad police Commissionerate and took up an investigation.

Jeevan Reddy was BRS MLA from Armoor constituency in Nizamabad district. He was elected twice in 2014 and 2018 but was defeated in the November 2023 elections.

INDIA bloc headed for clear mandate, says Jairam Ramesh

ongress in charge of communications, Jairam Ramesh, on Friday asserted the Indian National Developmental Inclusive Alliance (INDIA) bloc was headed for a clear and decisive mandate in the Lok Sabha polls.

Ramesh told the media here that trends from the first two phases had established that the INDIA bloc was set to form the government at the Centre, and cited how Prime Minister Narendra Modi's language has changed since April 19 and he started communalising his election strategy turning everything into a Hindu-Muslim issue.

The Congress General Secretary said the feedback from different states, where the party had fared badly in 2019, was quite encouraging and it was doing very well this time. He said history was repeating itself after 20 years. He said just like the Congress-led alliance stormed to power in 2004, it would storm to power this time also.

As regards the appointment of the Prime Minister, he said once the INDIA bloc gets a majority, the Prime Minister will be appointed within days. He said in 2004 it took three days to appoint Manmohan Singh and this



time, it may take even less than that.

Besides, he pointed out that in India, it is the party or the alliance which wins the elections, not an individual. He said in a parliamentary democracy like India, elections are not individual-centric.Ramesh reaffirmed 'Paanch Nyay' -- justice for farmers, youth, labourers, women and proportionate representation, with five guarantees each for every 'Nyay'. He said the Congress has guaranteed in its manifesto that the MSP (minimum support price) will have a legal status, besides, farmers' loans will be waived off.

Reducing plastic pollution by 5pc yearly may stabilise ocean microplastics: Study

utting down plastic pollution by 5 per cent per year may help stabilise the level of microplastics -- plastics less than 5 mm in length -- on the surface of oceans, finds

a study on Friday.
From human blood to testicles, to flora and fauna, microplastics have long been known as a significant environmental and health concern worldwide. To predict its impact on oceans, researchers at Imperial College London and GNS Science developed a model of eight different scenarios of plastic pollution reduction starting from 2026 up to 2100.

The results, published in Environmental Research Letters, showed that a reduction in plastic pollution by more than 5 per cent each year will stabilise and also prevent the increase of microplastics in the ocean. However, the modelling also predicted that even a yearly reduction of 20 per cent will "not significantly reduce existing microplastic levels, meaning they will persist in our oceans beyond 2100". Zhenna Azimrayat Andrews, from the Centre for Environmental Policy, Imperial College London noted that "stabilising



microplastic levels is the first step towards elimination" as they "never be a completely successful removal" from oceans.

"But the current global output of plastic pollution is so great, that even a 1 per cent annual reduction in pollution would make a big difference overall," added Zhenna. Meanwhile, the UN Environmental Assembly (UNEA) aims to adopt a legally binding resolution to completely eradicate the production of plastic pollution from 2040, including ocean microplastics. For this "a more coordinated international policy is necessary", and "changes should happen on an industrial and commercial level", the researchers argued.

Pune Police say Porsche crash accused was 'alert', faces 10-yr jail

he Pune Police on Friday said the minor accused in the Porsche crash in which two persons were killed, was 'fully in his senses' at the time of the accident, and they have prepared a watertight case which can put him behind bars for

Commissioner of Police Amitesh Kumar said the police were probing the case from all angles, right from the time when the accused left his house on May 18 (Saturday) night, and till the Porsche car disaster around 2.30 a.m. on May 19 (Sunday) that ignited protests and a nationwide furore.

On the discrepancies pertaining to the blood sample reports of the accused, the CP said that there were two blood reports taken, one in a private hospital and another in the government's Sassoon

Speaking to the media on reports speculating that the family driver had reportedly claimed he (the driver) was at the wheel, Kumar said that the matter is being probed as to why he (the driver) uttered it or who forced him (the driver) to make such a claim.

Referring to political charges that there were two FIRs lodged in the matter, Kumar said that in the first FIR registered on Sunday (May 19) morning the IPC Section 304A was invoked, and as the seri-



ousness of the came forth, even the stringent Section 304 was added.

"There has been pressure on the police... We are making an absolutely watertight case to ensure that the accused can go to jail for 10 years," Kumar

Two drown as boat overturns in Sindhudurg

t least two persons drowned and two oth-A arowned and a boat carrying a consign-ment of ice toppled in windy weather here, an official said on Friday. The incident happened late Thursday night near Vengurla Port.

"The body of one victim was fished out of the Arabian Sea waters this morning where it was flung by the strong water currents. Among those on the boat were five persons from Madhya Pradesh, one from Karnataka and one from

Ratnagiri in Maharashtra,' Sawant told reporter.

The local fire brigade, Vengurla Police and SDRF with the help of local fisherfolks have launched a rescue to trace the two missing persons, said Sawant.

The boat flipped over around 9.30 p.m. off Vengurla but the police and other authorities learnt of it only after the trio swam ashore by midnight and raised an alarm following which a rescue operation

was organised this morning. Evewitnesses said that owing to the strong winds lashing the region since Thursday evening the small boat seemed to have lost control, went astray in the sea waters and started sink

As per preliminary information, the ill-fated boat was transporting ice for the fishing vessels which use it to preserve the fresh catch before it is offloaded at various big and small ports.

Thane blast toll rises to 13, chemical stink and ash cover 4 km area

he death toll in the blast-cum-blaze of Amudan Chemicals Pvt Ltd factory in Dombivli town of Thane rose to 13 with another three bodies dug up from the rubble, officials said here on Friday. The disaster struck the industrial unit on Thursday afternoon.

Dombivli and surroundings of an area of around 4 km woke up to a strong stench of burnt chemicals and a thin layer of smoky ash on roads, shops and homes, from Thursday's tragedy and most people were seen moving around wearing face masks to avoid the stink

The NDRF, SDRF and Fire Brigade, which had halted operations after dark, resumed the rescue operations and recovered three more bodies from the rubble, while another 64 persons were injured and admitted to various hospitals.

While the blaze was extinguished Thursday night, cooling operations were underway, the search continued for more victims feared trapped under the debris, and the effects of the disaster were felt in a radius of over 2-3 km.

This morning, the Amudan factory premises



inside the Maharashtra Industrial Development Corporation (MIDC) resembled a war zone emitting a foul smell of burnt metal, crashed buildings, chemicals and deaths.

Late on Thursday evening, Chief Minister Eknath Shinde visited the tragedy site and said that in view of the risks posed by certain categories of industries, the government plans to shift such hazardous factories to another loca tion to avoid such disasters in future.

Shiv Sena (UBT)'s Leader of Opposition (Council) Ambadas Danve, who visited the accident site this morning called for booking the factory owners on charges of culpable homicide plus ordering a thorough probe into the incident. "The former Maha Vikas Aghadi (MVA) government had planned to shift at least five factories having risk-prone units, but the subsequent government did nothing in the matter," Danve said, pointing an accusing finger at the ruling MahaYuti regime.

The Thane Police have booked the owners of the factory, Malay Mehta and his wife Malati Mehta under various sections pertaining to negligence, culpable homicide, etc.

'Mini-Assembly' election in UP...?

ttar Pradesh could be heading for a mini-assembly election after the Lok Sabha polls are over if the 15 legislators contesting the parliamentary elections emerge as winners. The 15 legislators, including three ministers of the Yogi Adityanath government, are trying their luck in the elections while a Rajya Sabha member of BJP is also contesting the Lok Sabha polls. To fill up the assembly seats, vacated by the winning candidates, elections will have to be held within six months. The BJP, SP, Congress, RLD and Nishad Party have fielded their MLAs in the election for Lok Sabha seats of the state. The declared candidates include 13 state assembly members and two members of the Legislative Council. Not only the ruling BJP, but the SP has also fielded five of its MLAs candidates for the Lok Sabha elections. Leading from the front is the SP President and leader of the Opposition in the state, Akhilesh Yadav, who is contesting from the Kannauj Lok Sabha seat. Presently, Akhilesh is a member of the assembly representing the Karhal assembly segment of the Mainpuri Lok Sabha seat. To challenge BJP candidate and Union Defence Minister Rajnath Singh on the prestigious Lucknow Lok Sabha seat, SP has fielded MLA Ravidas Mehrotra, who represents the Lucknow Central Assembly seat. Among the two Congress MLAs, Virendra Chaudhary, elected from Pharenda assembly seat of Maharajganj district, is also contesting from Maharajganj Lok Sabha to challenge the BJP that has fielded Union minister Pankaj Chaudhary from Maharajganj Lok Sabha seat. The two members of the Legislative Council (Upper House) contesting the elections are BJP's Jitin Prasad and BSP's Bhimrao Ambedkar. The BSP has also given the ticket to its Legislative Council member Bhimrao Ambedkar from Hardoi seat

A border state that needs to be secured

The nation can still recall how Punjab was caught in the grip of terrorism in the latter 1980s that could be countered only through sustained use of armed police, socio-political efforts at restoring peace and the diplomatic initiatives taken for mobilising world opinion against the call of 'Khalistan'. The environment of hurt feelings amongst Sikhs created by Op Blue Star at the Golden Temple, the rise of Sant Jarnail Singh Bhindranwale as the fulcrum of the 'Khalistan movement' in the state, and the full exploitation of the situation by Pakistan which pumped in arms, explosives and trained militants into Punjab had all combined at that time to push the level of terrorist violence all over the state to an unprecedented high with things coming to a pass where people in Chandigarh and Mohali stopped leaving their houses after sunset. The comprehensive countermeasures of the state did succeed by the turn of the decade -- the execution of Operation Black Thunder in 1988, which was based on two fundamental precepts that no policeman would enter the premises of the Golden Temple and no bullet would be fired from outside towards the Temple, played a major part in turning the things around for the eventual return of peace to Punjab. What really marked the end of the chapter of terrorist violence in the border state was the restoration of Hindu-Sikh unity against the machinations of the external enemy to permanently damage their brotherly relations by instigating targeted killings on communal lines. This ground reality of peace rooted in Hindu-Sikh unity has held on for decades -- it found validation in the political alliance between the BJP and Akali Dal in recent times. Punjab happily is once more acknowledged as the prime contributor to the nation's defence as well as the country's food economy. The border state however is again being targeted by forces inimical to India. The situation in Punjab, with its strategic location, is becoming vulnerable in the face of the evil designs of the adversaries to revive the call of Khalistan outside India in the hope that this would produce an induction effect within the state. The people of Punjab are averse to any disruptive ideas and remain united in faith -- being totally devoted to the teachings of Guru Nanak and the recitation of 'Shabad' at Gurudwaras. There is complete socio-cultural harmony between Hindus and Sikhs in Punjab as also in the rest of the country. India's enemies are therefore trying to operate externally to work out ways of injecting trouble in the state from outside. The Khalistan movement is being revived in the US, Canada, Australia and the UK by enemy agents trying to work in the Sikh diaspora, particularly among the younger generations who had remained somewhat cut off from Punjab, the land of their origin, possibly losing some emotional attachment with India as well. They could fall for the separatist rhetoric more easily particularly when this was backed by the narrative of 'majoritarianism' and 'anti-minorityism' built against the regime by anti-India lobbies abroad often working with some of the civil society groups at home. In Punjab, sporadic attempts to use Gurudwaras to revive the Amritdhari cult have come to notice. Isolated incidents of assault on a Granthi or desecration of Guru Granth Sahib have to be guarded against



as they could prove to be the flag points for instigated trouble. It is also clearly evident that there is an organised attempt by the adversary to step up the induction of narcotics into Punjab from across the border to increase drug addiction among the youth there making them vulnerable to outside influence and the manoeuvring of enemy agents. Slowly but steadily the Paksupported Khalistan movement is raising its head in Sikh diaspora abroad, particularly since 2022. Vandalism against India's diplomatic missions, defacing of temples and glorifying past incidents pertaining to Khalistan terror in India have been resorted to in a planned manner. These subversive activities abroad have been accompanied by some violent actions on Indian soil as well. There was infiltration of Khalistan elements in the farmer's agitation of 2020 and on January 26, 2021, some Sikh protestors entered Red Fort and hoisted Nishan Sahib's flag there. Meanwhile, Amritpal Singh, a known Khalistan protagonist who had links with the US-based Sikhs For Justice (SFJ), along with thousands of supporters carrying a copy of Guru Granth Sahib and also some firearms, raided Ajnala Police Station near Amritsar on February 23, 2023, and forcibly secured the release of Loveprit Singh Toofan, an aid of Amritpal, arrested earlier in a case of violence.

Amritpal Singh, the leader of self-styled Waris Punjab De, is known to have been trained by Pak ISI and housed in Dubai which is an important hub of ISI. He visited Rode village in Moga district the birthplace of Sant Bhindranwale in an attempt to emulate the latter. He was finally arrested in April 2023 and shifted to Dibrugarh jail in Assam considering his potential for whipping up violence in Punjab. Apart from spreading the Khalistan movement, Amritpal Singh was actively involved in smuggling drugs into Punjab and promoting addiction amongst the youth of Punjab. All of this proved Pak ISI's hand behind the revival of Khalistan call in Punjab and the pumping of drugs into the state with the intention of raising a body of addicted youth who would do its bidding in subverting the border state through the separatist Khalistan movement. The Sino-Pak axis remains hostile to India and has become much more active after the abrogation of Article 370 by the Indian Parliament. The China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC) passes through the northern part of PoK and it was vehemently opposed by India. Operational collusion between China and Pakistan against India has lately been

reflected in the use of Chinese drones by Pak ISI for dropping arms and narcotic consignments in Kashmir and Punjab

There are reports of Pak-based Islamic militant outfits being used for building contacts with Sikh extremist elements in Punjab. Pak ISI is likely to repeat its modus operandi in Punjab and do a few things that had helped it in the 1980s to build terrorism in the state. Gurudwaras were used for indoctrinating and even sheltering militants, training in techniques of making IEDs was imparted -- cycle bombs made by packing RDx into the cylinders of a cycle and fitting it with a timer became a trademark of terror at that time -- and Hindu-Sikh enmity and distrust was whipped up by directing targeted killings of Hindus. Any beginnings of this kind of violence should be promptly noticed. Pak ISI knows it is not easy to build the Khalistan movement at present but buoyed by the Sino-Pak axis, it is determined to press for it by first promoting the idea outside and using pro-Khalistan groups to inject the same into Punjab. Pak ISI is prompted to concentrate on Punjab in line with its old K2 plan as the Centre had successfully controlled the situation in Kashmir after abrogating Art 370 of the Constitution. It would be prudent to set off coordinated measures in Punjab to mitigate any chances of the revival of the Khalistan idea in the state. Punjab needs to be put in charge of a Governor with a national security background who had knowledge of how the terrorist problem in the state was handled in the past. An important function of the Head of the state would be to guide and educate the state government about the operational measures needed to be put in place, particularly in a border state and the socio-political environment that had to be created to mitigate the threat of separatism in the name of Khalistan. Security of the border state has to be kept above party politics. Since the adversary this time is using the pro-Khalistan elements abroad to inject violence in Punjab, intelligence coverage of Khalistan groups outside India already identified had to be stepped up further. India has designated some leaders of Indian origin actively engaged in promoting the call of Khalistan in countries like the US and Canada and all efforts have to be made to get them extradited to India to face legal action. India has launched a diplomatic effort to counter the anti-India activity abroad and called the ruling elites in the concerned countries to check the same.

Watch on social media used for the spread of Khalistan separatism and indoctrination of youth has to be intensified and effective action taken particularly against insiders colluding with such activity -- under the new Penal codes passed by the Parliament in December last year. Democratic forces at home have to be encouraged to speak up against the subversive call of Khalistan and uphold the unity of India. We have to be ahead of the troublemakers within the country or outside in countering any threats to national security, integrity and sov-

Following the crash, a senior investigation committee composed of experts, specialists, and technicians arrived at the scene on Monday morning, the semi-official Tasnim news agency quoted the report by the General Staff of Iran's Armed Forces as saying on Friday.

After crashing into the mountain, the helicopter had caught fire, it said. South Korea sanctions 7 North Koreans, 2 Russian ships for illegal arms, fuel trade with Russia

Seoul | Agencies outh Korea on Friday imposed independent sanctions on seven North Koreans and two Provides Koreans and two Russian vessels for engaging in illicit weapons and fuel trade with Russia and other activities in violation of UN Korea seeks to step up efforts to curb the North's activities banned under multiple UN Security Council (UNSC) resolutions after a UN panel monitoring the enforcement of North Korean sanctions ended at the end of last month after Russia vetoed the resolution on extending the panel's mandate, Yonhap news agency reported.

Rim Yong-hyok, head of the Syrian unit of the Korea Mining and Development Trading Corp., a major North Korean arms dealer, is among the seven North Koreans.

Rim is suspected of involvement in the illegal trade of weapons and arms equipment with Russia. He was cited in the UN panel's March report on North Korean sanctions implementation as a man who handled weapons deals with Russia's Wagner merce-

Han Hyok-chol, head of Taeryong Trading Co., is accused of bringing Russian diesel into North Korea. Under Resolution 2397, adopted by the UNSC in 2017, UN member states are prohibited from exporting more than 4 mil-



lion barrels of crude oil and 5,00,000 barrels of refined oil to the North annually.

The five others are: Kim Jong-gil, Jang Hoyong, Ri Kyong-sik, Ri yong-min and Park Kwang-hyok. They are believed to have worked illegally at IT companies in Vladivostok in Russia's Far East to earn hard currency to fund the state's nuclear and missile programs -- also banned under Resolution 2375. The two Russian vessels. MAIA-1 and MARIA, are suspected of transporting containers loaded with military supplies to and from North Korea and Russia.

The sanctioned vessels need special approval from South Korean port authorities if they wish to enter a South Korean port.

Taiwan's airspace within 24 hours, the highest number of Chinese daily sorties so far this year. Among them, 35 Chinese military aircraft were spotted crossing the median line of the Taiwan Strait.

In addition, the ministry said it had detected 19 Chinese navy vessels and seven Chinese coast guard ships operating around Taiwan on Thursday. China on Thursday

launched a two-day major military exercise around Taiwan, apparently to simulate a blockade around the island.

On Friday, Taiwan's Air Force also released photos and videos taken on Thursday, which showed the



activities of Chinese Navy vessels and coast guard ships in the waters west of Taiwan. The Chinese military exer-

Israel limits Spanish diplomatic services over Palestine recognition

Tel Aviv | Agencies wo days after Spain announced its intention to recognise an independent state of Palestine, Israel has imposed restrictions on the work of Spanish diplomats in the country.

The Spanish Embassy in Tel Aviv and the Spanish Consulate General in East Jerusalem will in future be prohibited from offering their services to Palestinians from West Bank, Foreign Minister Israel Katz posted on the social media platform X on Friday

Katz justified the measure by pointing to a statement by Spain's Deputy Prime Minister, Yolanda Diaz, which he categorised as anti-Semitic.

"In response to Spain's recognition of a Palestinian state and the anti-Semitic call by Spain's deputy prime minister to not just recognise a Palestinian state but to 'liberate Palestine from the river to the sea', I have decided to sever the connection between Spain's representation in Israel and the



Palestinians," he wrote. In a speech shared on X, Diaz used the controversial slogan, "Palestine will be free from the river to the sea.'

It suggests that there should be a free Palestine in an area from the Jordan River to the Mediterranean Sea which includes the area where Israel is located.

Diaz belongs to the leftwing electoral alliance Sumar, a junior coalition partner of Prime Minister Pedro Sanchez.

Spain, Ireland and Norway announced on Wednesday that they plan to recognise an independent Palestinian state at the end of May. Israel reacted with indignation to these announcements.

here is unrest in Kyrgyzstan and around 1,200 children from Madhya Pradesh are stranded there. State Congress President Jitu Patwari has demanded from the state government to take necessary initiatives to bring the children safely.

Congress state president Jitu Patwari wrote on Twitter, "1,200 children of Madhya Pradesh are stranded in Kyrgyzstan. The Madhya Pradesh government has assured to take them out safely, but as per the political promise, there is no arrangement to bring them back.'

Citing the statements of students stranded in Kyrgyzstan, Patwari said, "Students say that Pakistan has evacuated its students from here, but the Indian government has not taken any concrete steps yet. Only in statements and media headlines. The government is active. In reality, the children living in the flats are not able to go out because they have to go hungry There is fighting going on. Local people are also beating up the girls.

Patwari further said, "Children say that earlier return tickets were available for around Rs 15-20 thousand, but since the situation has worsened, flight tickets are available for Rs 50 thousand. This is not possible for everyone. Expressing their displeasure, the children have also told the media that the Pakistan government has sent a free-of-cost flight to evacuate its students from Kyrgyzstan, but the



Indian government still seems to be unconcerned. Indian students stranded in Kyrgyzstan tagged the Indian Government, the Indian Embassy and the Foreign Minister on social media and appealed, but did not get any response. In this situation, children are more dejected and scared."

While describing the situation in Kyrgyzstan, Jitu Patwari wrote to the Chief Minister of the state, Dr. Mohan Yaday, "I have received information that some landlords are throwing out children living in flats in Bishkek. When they are going out, the local people Don't you know that their families are also very worried and are expecting that Madhya Pradesh will also take initiative in this serious situation. Will make efforts for the safe return of the children.'

Let us tell you that the Chief Minister of the state, Dr. Mohan Yadav had recently talked to the children stranded in Kyrgyzstan on video call and had also assured of their return soon.

Elderly man commits suicide by consuming poison in Guna

The deceased elderly Chintaharan has two sons and a daughter, who are married. Angered by the death of the old man, the family members took the body to the old bus stand intersection and blocked it. Police reached the spot and explained to the family members. After that the traffic jam ended. A postmortem of the body has been

The relatives of the deceased have told that about

eight months ago a person had borrowed Rs 50 thousand from them for two months. When Chinthaharan asked for money from that person, he refused to return the amount and also misled him. Also threatened and said that I will not return the money.

According to family members, the person who had borrowed money is of criminal nature. Once when Chinthaharan went with his son to ask for money, the person taking the loan threatened him and chased him away. Since then Chinthaaran was worried.

After retiring from the forest department job, he had received Rs 85 thousand, out of which he had lent Rs 50 thousand. Chintharan was upset over not getting back the loan amount and took the step of committing suicide.

when I did not have a great IPL season, I was really struggling for confidence, Karthik sat me down a couple of times and gave me a very honest explanation of how he is seeing things and maybe I am not able to see them myself," said Kohli in a tribute video posted by the franchise on

Karthik played in every season of the Indian Premier League since 2008, and it was his second stint in RCB after the 2015 sea-

son.


