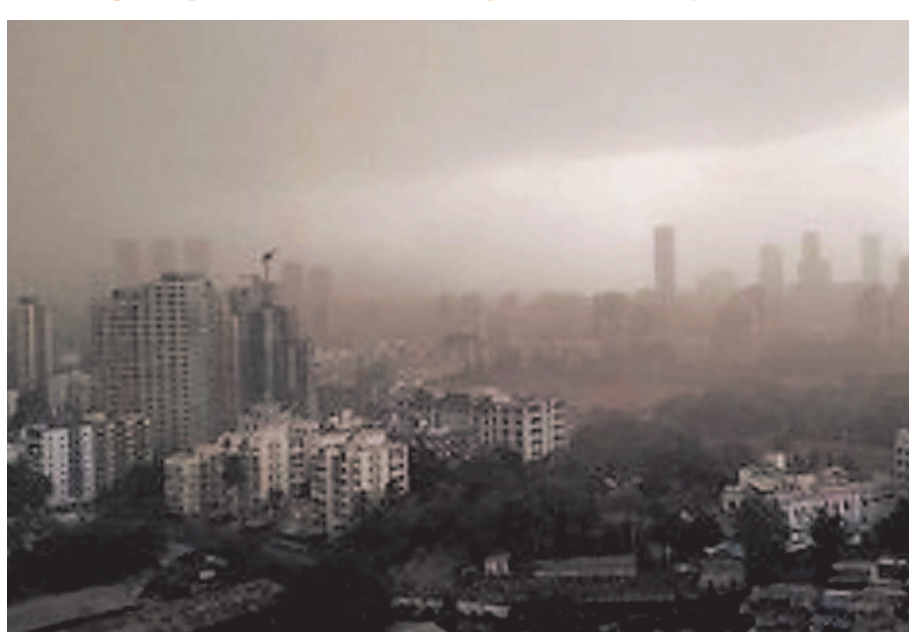

MASSIVE DUST STORM ENGULFS MUMBAI

The dust-storm, something rare for coastal Mumbai, whipped up suddenly with strong gusty winds around 3 p.m. and within minutes, enveloped almost the entire city, dipping visibility, darkening the atmosphere and hampering movement of vehicular traffic and pedestrians. After over an hour, the dustiness gave way to dark clouds with showers reported in many parts of Mumbai which appreciably dropped the scorching temperatures and also improved visibility to normal levels.

- ▶ A monstrous hoarding of advertisements crashed in the gusty winds on several houses and a petrol pump in Pant Nagar, Ghatkopar east suburb around 4.15 p.m.
- ▶ At least 54 people were left injured and another 70 are still feared trapped under the hoarding when many vehicles queued up to refill petrol and diesel.
- ▶ In Wadala, a multi-storied, vertical steel parking lot near the Shreeji Towers building crashed on a main road in the squally dust-storm this afternoon.
- ▶ The tumbling parking lot crushed around a dozen vehicles and one person sitting in a car was trapped, said the officials. -Local trains, a section of the metro network, and airport services were temporarily stopped amid a darkening sky.
- ▶ The suburban services on the main line have been stopped, the chief spokesperson of Central Railway said.
- ▶ The unseasonal rain brought some respite from the scorching heat, but power outage in Thane's Kalwa and some other areas led to more trouble for residents.



The causes of the dust storm in Mumbai, often referred to as the concrete jungle, were not immediately known, but the IMD had forewarned it in an alert earlier on Monday afternoon. Many people complained that their homes, shops, offices and other places were covered in a thick layer of dust that blew in abruptly before they could shut the doors and windows. At least 36 people were injured in various incidents after a massive dust-storm on Monday hit Mumbai, the country's commercial capital and surroundings, which are now bracing for a thunderstorm predicted to lash over the next few hours, officials said. The dust storm and gusty winds, coupled with light rains paralysed flight operations at the Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj International Airport (CSMIA), forcing suspension of services for around 66 minutes. The normal opera-

tions resumed at 5.03 p.m. but there were at least 15 flight diversions in the intervening period, said an official spokesperson. There were several incidents of tree crashes in different parts of Mumbai and Thane, a couple of road accidents, and other tragedies in the dust-storm, and more details are awaited. The BrihanMumbai Municipal Corporation (BMC) has issued a warning of a thunderstorm likely to hit parts of Mumbai with strong winds of 50-60 kmph, after dusk. The IMD Pune head K.S. Hosalkar said that a moderate to intense thunderstorm would hit Thane, Raigad, Palghar, Ahmednagar, Pune and Satara, besides parts of Mumbai. "Due to the inclement weather and dust storms in the city, Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj International Airport (CSMIA) temporarily suspended flight operations for around 66 minutes due to low visibil-

ity and gusty winds," Mumbai airport said in a statement. "Operations resumed at 17:03 hours. During this time, the airport saw 15 diversions. CSMIA last week completed its pre-monsoon runway maintenance successfully, ensuring safe and smooth aircraft operations. Committed to efficiency and passenger safety, the airport remains steadfast to prioritise seamless operations," it said. Maharashtra Deputy Chief Minister Devendra Fadnis in a post on X said the state government has ordered an investigation into the incident.

100 Feared Trapped After Massive Billboard Falls



Mumbai: A hundred people are feared trapped under the debris of a massive billboard that collapsed on a fuel station amid a strong dust storm in Mumbai's Ghatkopar this evening. Police said 35 people were injured, and 47 were rescued. The billboard was opposite the fuel station. Visuals show the structure crashing down right in the middle of the refuelling facility. The metal frame of the billboard tore through the roof of several cars that were at the fuel station. The police said teams of the National Disaster Response Force (NDRF) are at the site, and are looking for survivors trapped under the debris.

India signs 10-year pact to operate Chabahar Port in Iran

India on Monday signed a 10-year contract with Iran to develop and operate the Shahid Beheshti terminal at Chabahar port on Iran's south-eastern coast. The contract was signed in Tehran by India Ports Global Ltd (IPGL) and the Ports and Maritime Organisation of Iran in the presence of Union Ports, Shipping and Waterways Minister, Sarbananda Sonowal, the Indian Embassy in Iran posted on X. Under the agreement, government-owned IPGL will invest about \$120 million while there will be an additional \$250 million in financing, bringing the contract's value to \$370 million, Iranian Minister of Roads and Urban Development, Mehrdad Bazrpash, told journalists in Tehran. The agreement was signed in the presence of Sarbananda Sonowal, who flew to Tehran for the crucial event amid the hectic Lok Sabha poll campaign. Sonowal said with the signing of the agreement, the two countries have laid the foundations for India's long-term involvement in Chabahar. The new pact replaces an earlier agreement signed in 2016, allowing India to operate the Shahid Beheshti terminal in Chabahar port which was ad hoc in nature and had to be renewed every year. "Chabahar Port's significance transcends its role as a mere conduit between India

and Iran; it serves as a vital trade artery connecting India with Afghanistan and the Central Asian countries," Sonowal said after the signing of the agreement. "The signing of this contract will have a multiplier effect on the viability and visibility of Chabahar Port," Sonowal said, adding, "Chabahar is not only the closest Iranian port to India, but it is also an excellent port from a nautical point of view." India has been developing a terminal at the port in Chabahar to transport goods to Iran, and the landlocked countries of Afghanistan, Kazakhstan, and Uzbekistan. The new agreement with Iran would open a trade route between South Asia and Central Asia via Iran, bypassing Karachi and the Gwadar Port in Pakistan. There are plans to link the Chabahar Port with the International North-South Transport Corridor (INSTC) that connects India with Russia via Iran, giving India access to the Central Asian region. This would be an alternative route bypassing the congested Persian Gulf and Strait of Hormuz sea lanes. The development also comes at a time when China has been keen to increase its investments in ports and other coastal infrastructure in Iran. Meanwhile, External Affairs Minister S. Jaishankar said in Mumbai that the agreement would provide the pathway for bigger investments and more linkages coming out of the seaport.

PM Modi guarantees 'Viksit Bihar' will be reality soon

As he addressed back-to-back public meetings in Bihar's Hajipur, Muzaffarpur, and Saran on Monday, Prime Minister Narendra Modi detailed his and BJP's "unwavering dedication" to build a 'Viksit Bharat' and a 'Viksit Bihar' by launching a slew of infrastructure and connectivity projects that will ultimately lead to significant development and employment generation in the state. "Modi's decision to modernise more than 90 railway stations in Bihar reinforces the commitment to job creation. Additionally, the construction of four crore pucca houses across the country, including 40 lakh in Bihar alone, has not only provided



shelter but also stimulated economic activity. The procurement of construction materials from local shops has further benefited Bihar's youth by fostering employment, trade, and entrepreneurial opportunities," PM Modi said in Hajipur. With the Congress making 'youth unemployment' a major issue during the ongoing Lok Sabha elections,

Prime Minister Modi stated how several ongoing projects in Bihar have created jobs for the youth in various sectors. "Over the past decade, the expansion of highways, including the construction of expressways, coupled with ongoing projects such as fertiliser factories and thermal power plants in Bihar, indicates substantial employment potential.

SUSHIL MODI, EX DY CM OF BIHAR PASSES AWAY

New Delhi: Senior BJP leader and Rajya Sabha member Sushil Modi died at Delhi's All-India Institute of Medical Sciences this evening. The 72-year-old was battling cancer and was admitted in the intensive care unit of AIIMS for the last one month.



The stalwart leader, once the BJP's best-known face in Bihar, had opted out of the ongoing Lok Sabha elections also on account of his health. He had announced it on social media with a post on X, formerly Twitter, on April 3. His absence was expected to be felt the most in Bihar, where he had considerable influence on the party, built over three decades. Over 11 years between 2005 and 2020, in two stints, he had served as the Deputy Chief Minister Nitish Kumar.

INDIA bloc will form govt at Centre on June 4: Rahul Gandhi

As voting is underway for the fourth phase on 96 Lok Sabha seats across 10 states and union territories on Monday, Congress leader Rahul Gandhi urged people to exercise their right to vote and exuded confidence that India bloc winning the elections. Rahul said voting for the fourth phase is underway, and "it has already been clear from the first three phases that the INDIA bloc will form a government at the Centre on June 4." Emphasising the significance of voting and urging people to participate in large numbers, he wrote: "Remember, your one vote will not only protect your democratic rights but will also change the fate of your entire family." "One vote is equal to the first job of Rs one lakh per year guaranteed for youth. One vote is equal to Rs one lakh per year in the bank account of poor women," he added, highlighting his election promises. Reiterating that voting could bring about significant changes, the Congress leader added: "So come out in large numbers and vote and show that the country will now vote on its issues - it will not get



distracted!" With the completion of the third phase of the general elections, voting has taken place in 283 parliamentary constituencies across 20 states/union territories. The counting of votes is scheduled for June 4.

CBSE Class 10 and 12 results declared

The Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) has announced the much anticipated results for the class 10 and 12 examinations on May 13, 2024. Students can check their results on the official websites including cbse.gov.in, cbseresults.nic.in, results.digilocker.gov.in, and umang.gov.in. The collective sigh of relief echoes with an overall pass percentage of 87.98% for class 12th, marking a notable increase of 0.65% compared



to the previous year. The overall pass percentage of Class 10th 2024 has been recorded at 93.60 per cent this year, which is an increase of 0.48 per cent from last year's 93.12 per cent.

KP.2 Covid variant appears more transmissible, but not virulent: Doctors

The new KP.2 Covid-19 variant appears to be more transmissible, but is not virulent, said doctors on Monday, amid reports of 91 cases being detected in Maharashtra. KP.1.1, and KP2 strains are part of the new variant dubbed FLiRT, based on the technical names for their mutations, one of which includes the letters "F" and "L", and another of which includes the letters "R" and "T". Genome sequencing of March and April revealed 91 cases of KP2 in Maharashtra -- Pune (51), Thane (20),

Amravati (7), Aurangabad (7), Solapur (2), Ahmednagar (1), Nashik (1), Latur (1), and Sangli (1). "There is no reason to believe that the FLiRT group of variants being reported are more virulent than the existing variants," Dr Lancelot Pinto, Consultant Pulmonologist and Epidemiologist, P. D. Hinduja Hospital and MRC, Mahim, told reporter. "KP2 appears to be more transmissible," he added. The doctor advised people who are immunocompromised to take precautions such as masking, avoiding crowded closed spaces, and keeping comorbidities under control.

FLiRT variants belong to the Omicron lineage, which was highly transmissible and showed great immune escape. First identified globally in January, KP2 is a descendant of Omicron's JN.1. Data from the US Centers for Disease Control and Prevention shows that KP2 accounted for about 25 per cent of new sequenced cases in the country in the last weeks of April. The symptoms of the new variant typically include a sore throat, runny nose, congestion, tiredness, fever (with or without chills), headache, muscle pain, and sometimes loss of taste or smell.

62.84 PER CENT POLLING IN 'PEACEFUL' FOURTH PHASE

An approximate voter turnout of 62.84 per cent, as of 8 p.m., was recorded in the largely peaceful polling on Monday for the fourth phase of the Lok Sabha elections covering 96 constituencies across 10 states and one UT, with West Bengal (8 seats) logging the highest polling at 75.94 per cent and Jammu and Kashmir (1 seat), the lowest at 36.58 per cent, the Election Commission said. However, the polling in the Srinagar constituency of J&K - its first election since the abrogation of Article 370 - was the highest since the 40.94 per cent turnout recorded in 1996.



The weather was largely conducive, with no marked heat wave-like conditions, leading to an enthusiastic response from the voters, young and old. Madhya Pradesh, where 8 seats went to the polls in the state's final phase, recorded a 68.63 per cent turnout, while Andhra Pradesh, where simultaneous polls to the state's 25 parliamentary constituencies and 175 Assembly seats were held, recorded 68.12 per cent turnout, which is set to increase as voting was on at a few booths even at 9 p.m.



AMIT SHAH PREDICTS 'HUGE VICTORY' IN SOUTH, NAMES FOUR STATES WHERE BJP WILL BAG SEATS

Union Home Minister Amit Shah on Monday reiterated claims of BJP's 'solid' performance in the ongoing polls and claimed the party is awaiting a 'huge victory' in the Southern states.

In an exclusive interview with NDTV, the Home Minister said that the BJP is moving towards big victory in four Southern states including Andhra Pradesh, Telangana, Tamil Nadu and Karnataka.

Notably, 'Mission South' is one of the key thrusts of the BJP this time, as the party aims to cross past the '400 mark', a goal set by Prime Minister Narendra Modi.

Amit Shah predicts 'huge victory' in South, names four states where BJP will bag seats.

The four states - Karnataka, Andhra Pradesh, Telangana, and Tamil Nadu together sent 109 seats to Lok Sabha, out of which BJP won 29 in 2019 elections.

In Tamil Nadu and Andhra Pradesh, BJP drew a blank but this time it is hoping for 'magnificent'



gains in both states, besides opening its account in Kerala.

The Home Minister also spoke on a couple of issues including the Opposition's charges on

Constitution change and reservations. Taking the opposition to task, he asked it to refrain from inventing fake narratives and not mislead the voters to derail the democratic

process.

"Modi ji became Prime Minister twice. He had a clear mandate both times. So, if the BJP government wanted to change the Constitution, or remove reservation, who could have stopped us?" Amit Shah said.

"Rahul Gandhi wants to mislead the country. The people of the country know this. Either he is delusional or is spreading delusion," he added. Amit Shah also highlighted how the BJP government used its majority to finish Article 370, Triple Talaq, to build Ram Mandir, to conduct a surgical strike, to land Chandrayaan, to save 130 crores during the Covid pandemic and also undertook wide-ranging projects to ease up the life of common people.

On queries about the fall in stock markets, he said that the market crash shouldn't be linked with elections.

Highlighting that a stable government helps shoot up markets, he said that the markets will see a fresh surge after June 4, as the BJP-led alliance will return to power with a thumping majority.

Income Tax Dept rolls out new functionality in AIS for taxpayers

The Income Tax Department has now rolled out a new functionality in Annual Information Statement (AIS) to display the status of the information confirmation process to taxpayers, according to a statement issued by the Central Board of Direct Taxes (CBDT) on Monday.

This functionality will display whether the feedback of the taxpayer has been acted upon by the source, by either, partially or fully accepting or rejecting the same. In case of partial or full acceptance, the information is required to be corrected by filing a correction statement by the source.

The following attributes shall be visible to the taxpayer for status of Feedback confirmation from source.

Whether feedback is shared for confirmation: This will let the taxpayer know if the feedback has been shared with the Reporting Source for confirmation or not. Feedback Shared On: This will let the taxpayer know the date on which the feedback has been shared with the Reporting Source for confirmation.

Source Responded On: This will let the taxpayer know the date on which the Reporting Source has responded to the feedback shared with it for confirmation. Source Response: This will let the taxpayer know the response provided by the Source on the taxpayer's feedback (if any correction is required or not).



"This new functionality is expected to increase transparency by displaying such information in AIS to the taxpayer," the official statement said. AIS is available to all registered income taxpayers through the compliance portal, accessible through the e-filing website (www.incometax.gov.in).

AIS provides details of numerous financial transactions undertaken by the taxpayer which may have tax implications.

AIS is based on financial data received from multiple information sources.

In AIS, the taxpayer has been provided with functionality to furnish feedback on every transaction displayed therein. This feedback helps the taxpayer to comment on the accuracy of the information provided by the Source of such information. In the case of wrong reporting, the same is taken up with the Source for their confirmation, in an automated manner. Information confirmation is currently made functional with regard to information furnished by Tax Deductors/Collectors and Reporting Entities, the statement added.

SC issues notice to ED on ex-Jharkhand CM Hemant Soren's plea

The Supreme Court on Monday issued a notice to the Enforcement Directorate (ED) on a plea filed by former Jharkhand Chief Minister Hemant Soren challenging his arrest in connection with a money laundering case linked to an alleged land scam.

Agreeing to examine Soren's latest Special Leave Petition challenging the dismissal of his writ petition by the Jharkhand High Court, a Bench presided over by Justice Sanjiv Khanna asked the anti-money laundering agency to file its reply in the matter by May 17.

However, the Bench, also comprising Justice Dipankar Datta, refused to pass any directions on the prayer for interim relief.



Last week, the top court disposed of a separate plea filed by Soren seeking his release in view of the elections.

It said that the Jharkhand Mukti Morcha (JMM) leader's prayer has become infructuous in view of the May 3 order passed by the Jharkhand High Court dismissing his plea against arrest. Earlier, the Supreme

Court had issued a notice to the ED on Soren's plea seeking interim bail on the grounds of delay in delivery of judgment by the Jharkhand High Court, despite reserving an order on his petition challenging the ED arrest in the last week of February.

After the top court issued the notice, the Jharkhand High Court pronounced its decision and dismissed Soren's plea, saying that "there is an abundance of documents that lay a foundation for the arrest and remand of the petitioner to police and judicial custody."

Hemant Soren resigned from the chief minister's post on January 31, after the ED informed him that it was arresting him under the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA).

REVIEW PLEA FILED IN SC AGAINST EVM-VVPAT TALLY VERDICT

A review petition has been filed in the Supreme Court against its recent verdict dismissing a batch of petitions seeking mandatory cross-verification of the votes cast in Electronic Voting Machines (EVMs) with Voter-Verifiable Paper Audit Trail (VVPAT) slips.

The review petition, filed under Article 137 of the Constitution, stated that there are "mistakes and errors apparent on the face of the impugned order" and the judgment is liable to be reviewed.

On April 26, a bench of Justices Sanjiv Khanna and Dipankar Datta said that while it acknowledged the fundamental right of voters to ensure their vote is accurately recorded and counted, the same cannot be equated with the right to 100 per cent counting of VVPAT slips, or a right to physical access to the VVPAT slips, which the voter should be permitted to put in the drop box.

The apex court said that giving physical access to VVPAT slips to voters is "problematic and impractical", and will lead to misuse, malpractices, and disputes. It rejected the submission to return



to the ballot paper system as "foible and unsound", adding that the weakness of the ballot paper system is well-known and documented.

However, the Supreme Court passed two directions not because it had any doubt, but to only further strengthen the integrity of the election process. First, all Symbol

Loading Units (SLUs) will be sealed on or after May 1 on completion of the symbol loading process and will be kept in the strong room at least for 45 days post declaration of results.

"The candidates or representatives shall sign the seal. The containers containing SLUs shall be kept in strong rooms, along with

EVMs, at least for a period of 45 days post-declaration of results. They shall be opened, examined and dealt with as in the case of EVMs," the top court said.

Second, the burnt memory or microcontroller in 5 per cent of the EVMs per Assembly segment of a parliamentary constituency will be checked and verified by a team of engineers from EVM manufacturers post announcement of results on a written request made by candidates securing second and third-highest votes. "All candidates or their representatives shall have the option to remain present at the time of verification. Such a request should be made within a period of seven days from the date of the declaration of results...The actual cost or expenses for the said verification will be notified by the ECI and the candidates making the said request will make payment of said expenses. Expenses will be refunded in case EVM is found to be tampered" with, the apex court ordered.

It said that the District Election Officer in consultation with the team of engineers will certify the authenticity and intactness of the burnt memory or the microcontroller.

INDIA bloc will win 315 seats, BJP 195: Mamata Banerjee

West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee on Monday predicted that the India bloc will at least win 315 seats while the BJP will win a maximum of 195 seats.

"The polling so far has been good. That is why the leaders of the ruling party at the Centre are tense. They have realised that Narendra Modi will not be back as the Prime Minister. They should not brag about 400 seats anymore. They will only win 195 seats while the INDIA bloc will win 315," Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee said at an election rally at Bongaon Lok Sabha constituency in North 24 Parganas district on Monday. She said that the people of the Matua community will have to fill the applications under the Citizenship Amendment Act (CAA) to get citizenship.

"If the Prime Minister has so much love for the Matuas,



he should grant them citizenship without asking them to fill up the CAA form. We are determined to stop the implementation of CAA at any cost. If they want to do it, they will have to do it over my dead body," the Chief Minister said. She also

accused the BJP of spending crores of rupees to tarnish the image of West Bengal by fuelling unrest in Sandeshkhali. "They are insulting the women of Sandeshkhali," the Chief Minister said.

Odisha CEO directs arrest of 2 presiding officers in Ganjam, three others suspended

As Odisha voted in the first phase of its simultaneous Lok Sabha and Assembly elections on Monday, the state's Chief Electoral Officer directed the suspension and arrest of two presiding officers in Ganjam district for serious dereliction of duty, while three others in Ganjam and Kalahandi have been suspended.

"We have ordered the Ganjam District Collector to put three presiding officers on suspension and arrest two of them as well as they have committed serious dereliction of duty. The presiding officers of polling booths number 27 and 163 in Chatrapur will be suspended and arrested. Similarly, it has



been ordered to suspend the presiding officer of polling station number 193 in Gopalpur," CEO Nikunja Bihari Dhal said.

The accused officials were allegedly found to be influencing voters to vote for a particular political party. Earlier, a polling officer

posted at Narla in Kalahandi district and a presiding officer at Chikiti in Ganjam were placed under suspension over dereliction of duty.

As per the Election Commission of India, Odisha has registered 62.96 per cent voter turnout till 5 p.m.

Bihar: RJD files complaint after people 'not allowed' to vote in Munger

RJD leaders on Monday filed a complaint before the Election Commission claiming that scores of voters were "not allowed" to exercise their franchise in Bihar's Munger Lok Sabha constituency.

The fourth phase of polling for the five seats including Munger, Darbhanga, Begusarai, Samastipur and Ujiarpur ended at 6 pm on Monday.

A delegation of RJD leaders led by Rajya Sabha MP Manoj Jha filed the complaint before the election commission. They pointed out irregularities allegedly which took place during voting in the Munger Lok Sabha con-



stituency. The RJD leaders claimed voters were not allowed to vote in Lakhisarai, Mokama and Barahia in the Munger Lok Sabha constituency and district administrations of Patna and Lakhisarai did not help them.

They have urged the Election Commission to take cognisance of the matter and take appropriate action. So that people who are deprived of voting can cast their vote peacefully.

Returning Officer suspended in Ujjain

Voting for the fourth and last phase of Lok Sabha elections in Madhya Pradesh's eight parliamentary seats was underway on Monday.

A returning officer in Ujjain was suspended after he was found violating election norms at a polling booth.

With rain showers bringing down the temperature slightly, the voters are turning out in large numbers. An average 15 per cent voter turnout was recorded till 9 a.m., according to the Election Commission's data. Ujjain recorded the highest voter turnout at 16.80 per cent, while Indore registered lowest at 11.48 per cent. Voter turnout in Khandwa, Khargone and Dewas was recorded at 14.68 per cent, 13.35 per cent and 16.79 per cent respectively.

Similarly, voter turnout in Dhar, Mandsaur and Ratlam was recorded at 15.61 per cent, 16.61 per cent and 13.73 per cent respectively. Reserved seats where polling is underway are Ratlam Scheduled Tribe (ST), Dhar (ST),



Khargone (ST), Ujjain Scheduled Caste (SC) and Dewas (SC). Three non-reserved seats where voting is underway are - Khandwa, Indore and Mandsour. A strong 1,63,70,654 electorate, including 82,48,091 men, 81,22,175 women and 388 third-gender persons are expected to seal the fate of 74 candidates. The eight constituencies spread over 64 assembly segments in 15 districts in the state's Malwa-Nimar region, are considered the bastion of the BJP. The Indore Lok Sabha seat has the maximum number of 14 candidates and Khargone has the least five nominees. Out of the eight seats, Indore also has the highest number of eligible voters at 25,26,803, while Ujjain has the least number of 17,98,704 electors, the CEO said.

5 dead as military truck crashes into bus, car after tyre burst in Rajgarh

At least five persons, including two Army jawans, were killed in an accident in Madhya Pradesh's Rajgarh district on Monday.

Several others were injured and have been rushed to a nearby hospital for treatment. The incident occurred when the tyre of an Army truck burst, after which the vehicle hit a passenger bus on the National Highway (NH-46) in Rajgarh district.

passenger Hariom Shivhare (26) died on the spot, while 15 persons, including two military personnel, sustained injuries. The injured military personnel were referred to Bhopal for treatment, he said.

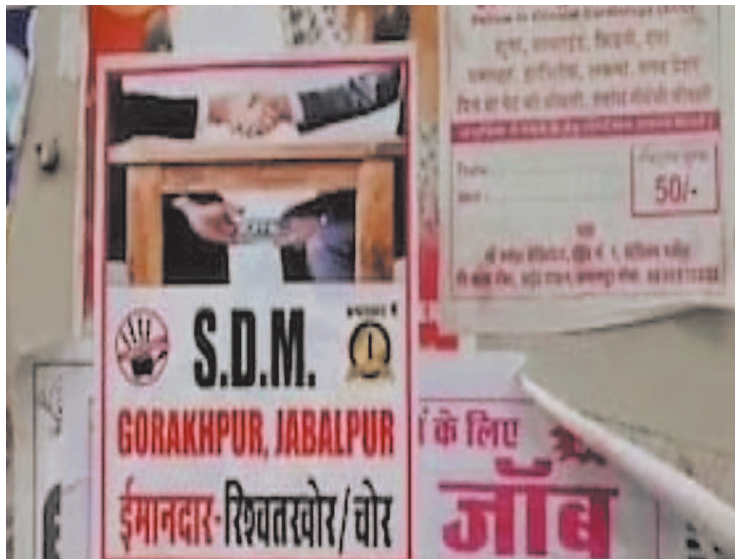
Posters of an officer put up in Jabalpur, calling him a bribe-taking SDM

How Kashmir saw decline in Hindu numbers

As the debate rages on the decline of the Hindu population, the exodus of the minority community from Kashmir is a case for study. It took only a couple of years for a 'motivated ecosystem' to reduce a happy contented Kashmiri Pandit community into rootless, shattered refugees. From a number of over seven lakh in 1990, the community has only a few thousand left in the Valley with a majority of them being government employees living in protected areas.

For the present-day generation, it may come as a surprise to know that Kashmir was once a Hindu land. Great emperors like Lalitaditya Muktapada ruled the Valley. Kashmir was also a seat of learning. Sharada Peeth established by Kashmiri Pandits was on par with Nalanda and Takshila. However, the decline started with the advent of Islam in the Valley in the 14th century.

After continued persecution which continued till 1948, the divided Valley was left with about six per cent Kashmiri Pandits.

Over the decades, this percentage gradually decreased. Pandits moved to other parts of India due to discriminatory policies and attitudes of the governments in the state administration and political class which was shielded by Article 370.

Till late 1980s, the population had come down to almost two per cent. In February 1986, organised attacks were carried out against the Kashmiri Pandits in Anantnag district. Many houses were looted and temples burnt.

This was followed by a full-blown terror onslaught the target of which was the Kashmiri Pandit community which everyone perceived to be pro-India.

The minorities were ruthlessly attacked. It was during the tenure of Farooq Abdullah, who became the Chief Minister on November 7, 1986 (till January 18, 1990) that Kashmir witnessed organised attacks on Kashmiri Pandits.

The Home Minister of the country was Mufti Mohd Sayed, a Kashmiri Muslim who was largely suspected by the community to be behind the 1986 Anantnag riots.

Hundreds were killed, many kidnapped, women were abducted and raped. Many were brutally killed and bodies hung from trees and poles.

Mosques were openly used to carry out anti-India and anti-Hindu agendas. Loudspeakers atop mosques would blaze slogans against the Kashmiri Pandits. As targeted violence was unleashed on minorities, there was no one to help them or stand for them. Threats were openly given in local vernacular newspapers; posters were pasted on Hindu homes and hit lists were released.

The Pakistan-backed ecosystem openly gave only three options to the Kashmiri Pandits - convert, face death or flee. The community chose to flee, leaving movable and immovable properties, temples and shrines, treasured books and archives.

A whole community, which is the original native of the land and has a rich heritage of over 5,000 years, was suddenly uprooted, thrown in the hot plains of the country and forced to live in tattered tents and camps.

In the Valley, there was no remorse, no one came forward to



help the beleaguered community. There were no political voices, or human rights organisations in the Valley who could raise the voice for the persecuted Hindus.

Once the Kashmiri Pandits were forced out, the next on the agenda of the ecosystem was to usurp the properties. Hindu houses were looted and many of the stolen goods were put up for sale in markets by looters. Lands were encroached upon and taken over. A majority of the Hindu house owners were forced to sell their houses and lands for peanuts.

Three decades after the mass exodus, there is no case of ethnic cleansing or genocide. What happened to Kashmiri Pandits is termed as mass migration as if the community people willingly left their homes to live in tents in hot humid conditions.

No one stands guilty and none has been sentenced for the crimes perpetrated against the minority Hindus. All those perpetrators who were directly or indirectly involved in killings/kidnappings/rapes and gang-rapes/ arson and loot were not outside marauders like in earlier centuries but were locals. In a majority of cases, the attackers were known, either neighbours or colleagues or friends.

While the victims knew who the attackers were, the police, administration and the political class had just shut their eyes to the plight of the Kashmiri Pandits. They were probably following the plan to a perfect execution, which was done meticulously.

The ecosystem was so strong and well organised that it challenged the country's secular ethos and converted the Muslim-majority Kashmir into almost a 'Hindu-free' place in the 1990s.

The political class that existed in the Valley when the Kashmiri

Pandits were being persecuted continues to be there today as well. They remained silent in those times and have till today not sought justice for fellow Kashmiri minorities. There has been no SIT or judicial commission to probe the persecution and the exodus.

The only time the country's justice system mentioned the tragedy of the community was during the trial of JKLF chief Yasin Malik. The National Investigation Agency (NIA) told a Delhi court in 2022 during arguments on the sentencing of Yasin Malik in a terror funding case that he was responsible for the Kashmiri Pandits' exodus from the Valley.

On June 11, 1999, the National Human Rights Commission (NHRC) in a ruling stated that the violence against the community was genocide-like and stopped short of terming it as genocide.

The Supreme Court too dismissed petitions seeking a probe into the alleged mass murder of Kashmiri Pandits in the valley in 1989-1990. However, a judgment authored by Justice Sanjay Kishan Kaul on the abrogation of Article 370 in 2023 did mention the ordeal of the community and recommended a structural investigation of the events and a Truth and Reconciliation Commission to rebuild the social fabric and heal wounds.

Today the same community is struggling to keep alive its culture, language and traditions. The faceless ecosystem that worked to uproot the Kashmiri Hindus from the Valley is today sitting pretty, somewhere unidentified and scouting for new lands.

Gaza war to determine lives of Israelis for decades, says Yoav Gallant

The outcome of the ongoing Gaza war between Israel and Hamas will determine the lives of Israelis in the coming decades, Defence Minister Yoav Gallant said on Monday.

"This is a war with no alternative," said Gallant during a speech to mark the country's official memorial day to commemorate its fallen soldiers.

"This is a war that will continue until we return our hostages, smash Hamas' rule and its military capabilities, and return the State of Israel to its prosperity and creativity and bring back a smile to citizens' faces," the minister said.

Israel began its military campaign to eliminate Hamas following the unprecedented October 7 attacks on southern Israel when the Hamas-led militants killed around 1,200 peo-



ple, mostly civilians and took a further 250 people hostage in the Gaza Strip.

Israel responded with massive airstrikes and launched a ground offensive into the sealed-off coastal area at the end of October.

Some 35,000 Palestinians have been killed in the war so

far, according to Gaza's Hamas-controlled health authority.

Gallant said one of the aims of the Israeli military campaign was to enable the roughly 250,000 Israeli citizens who had to leave their homes near Gaza and Lebanon amid fighting with the Shiite Hezbollah militia to return.

Israel marked its annual Memorial Day for the Fallen Soldiers of the Wars of Israel and Victims of Actions of Terrorism on Monday.

According to the Defence Ministry, more than 25,000 soldiers and Jewish fighters have been killed in conflict since 1860.

The count begins with the immigration of Jews into what is now Israel long before the founding of the state in 1948. Sirens sounded for two minutes across the country on Monday morning to commemorate the dead.

Since October 7, more than 700 Israeli security forces have been killed, including 620 soldiers, according to the Defence Ministry.

The figures include both those killed by militants in the October 7 attacks and during the Gaza war.

Kyiv admits 'tactical successes' of Russian troops in Kharkiv

The Ukrainian military conceded on Monday that Russian forces are making progress in their offensive in the north-eastern Kharkiv region.

Moscow's troops have been engaged in a concerted push into the region, raising alarm among Ukrainians and their Western allies that a large-scale assault on the major city of Kharkiv is coming.

Kharkiv city, the second-largest in Ukraine, is located just 30 kilometres south of the Russian border.

"The enemy is currently achieving tactical success," the Ukrainian General Staff said in its situation report posted on social media early Monday morning.



Following the capture of several villages in the predominantly Russian-speaking Kharkiv region, fighting is currently underway around the city of Vovchansk, only 5 kilometres from the Russian border, the General Staff of the Ukrainian Armed

Forces said.

Despite incurring heavy losses, Ukraine said the Russian military is deploying significant forces in the battle for Vovchansk, with up to five battalions bearing down on the city. Vovchansk had come under Russian occupation at the beginning of the war. During Ukraine's autumn offensive in 2022 in the Kharkiv region, Russian troops withdrew from Vovchansk. According to Ukrainian figures, around 3,500 people were still living in the city at the time.

Russia launched a renewed campaign in the Kharkiv region on May 10. Over the past two days, the Russian Defence Ministry has reported the capture of nine villages.

German digital group reports rise in cyber attacks from Russia, China

The German digital association Bitkom says it has recorded an increasing number of cyber attacks from China and Russia over the past 12 months. Within two years, a doubling of attacks from Russia has been measured, said managing director Bernhard Rohleder on Monday morning on German public broadcaster ZDF.

There was also a 50 per cent increase in the number of known incidents from China, he said. Of the companies affected, 80 per cent were targeted by attacks, such as data theft, espionage and sabotage, according to the Bitkom Director. Germany's Interior Minister Nancy Faeser and the president of the Federal Criminal Police Office (BKA), Holger Munch, plan to present the "National Situation Report on Cybercrime" for 2023 on Monday morning.

In particular, the number of offences committed from abroad or from an unknown location has been increasing for years, the BKA said in advance. This also applies to the amount of damage caused by cybercrime to companies in Germany.

"The damage is 148 billion euros (\$159 billion) per year from cyber attacks alone, meaning digital attacks," said Bitkom's Rohleder. "That is a very significant amount." Organised crime is often behind these attacks, as are foreign intelligence services, he added. "Some are after money," Rohleder said, adding that other perpetrators want to cause as much damage as possible, such as to critical infrastructure like the energy supply or hospitals. "And there are still some, especially private individuals, who just want to have fun," he said.

Protestors inch closer to Muzaffarabad in PoK as talks fail

An uneasy calm prevails in Pakistan-occupied Kashmir's Muzaffarabad as the government announced a holiday for one more day in offices and educational institutions of the region amid fears of more riots and violence. A complete shutdown and wheel jam strike is being observed in the city in support of a long march being taken out by the Azad Jammu Kashmir (AJK) Joint Action Committee aka People Action Committee, which is marching towards Muzaffarabad from Rawalakot and other parts of Pakistan-occupied Kashmir (PoK), protesting against rising inflation and high electricity bills.

As protestors marched towards Muzaffarabad, violent confrontations were witnessed between the security forces and the protestors over the last two days, resulting in the death of a police official and over 45 other personnel getting injured.

"In Muzaffarabad only, at least 35 police officials have been injured so far after being beaten by angry protestors. There is a complete shutter down strike in the city for the third day. Everything is closed and locals are having problems in managing their



daily household requirements of food and medicine," a local resident told correspondent on Monday.

The deadlock between the protestors and the government prevailed as the negotiations failed, prompting senior leadership of the People Action Committee in Rawalakot to announce the continuation of the march towards Muzaffarabad.

"The government is playing tactics of making false commitments and delaying the entire issue. All of it is nothing but a lie and a fraud. We do not agree with it and the march towards Muzaffarabad will continue," said Sardar Nazeer Kashmiri, a senior leader of the People Action Committee.

The protest has prompted President Asif

Ali Zardari to call an emergency meeting with senior leaders Sardar Yaqoob, Chaudhry Yasin, Chaudhry Yasin and Latif Akbar.

On the other hand, Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif has also called an emergency meeting with the PPP and PML-N leadership of the region.

People Action Committee has put forward three major demands to the government and has been protesting for over a year, demanding fulfilment of commitments. It includes providing free electricity (or at a production price of Rs 5 per unit), subsidised flour like being provided in Gilgit Baltistan and immediate stopping of perks and privileges being given to ministers, officers, bureaucrats and others.

People Action Committee maintains that it will not call off its long march towards Muzaffarabad until these demands are met and implemented by the government. The protestors are also planning an indefinite protest sit-in after reaching Muzaffarabad. Heavy security deployment is guarding all entry points into Muzaffarabad as the long march protest inches closer with every passing hour.





Amit Shah slams Uddhav Thackeray for backing Congress' agenda

Targeting Shiv Sena (UBT) chief Uddhav Thackeray, Home Minister Amit Shah on Monday asked the former Maharashtra chief minister if he was backing the Congress which "supports" Pakistani terrorist Ajmal Kasab who was involved in the 2008 Mumbai terror attack. Speaking at a rally in Maharashtra's Dhule Lok Sabha constituency to garner support for Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) nominee Subhash Bhamre, HM Shah, posed several questions for Uddhav Thackeray. "Congress leaders are supporting Kasab. I ask Uddhav Thackeray -- are you with the Congress leaders? The Congress wants to bring back Muslim Personal Law, are you with them? Rahul Gandhi opposes Veer Savarkar, do you agree with him? Udhayanidhi Stalin opposes Sanatan



Dharma, are you supporting him?" he asked. Uddhav Thackeray's Shiv Sena (UBT) is an alliance partner of the Congress -- the principal opposition party.

Addressing the rally, HM Shah also wondered why the Congress as well as Uddhav Thackeray, despite being invited for the January 22 Pran Partishtha ceremony of Ram Mandir in Ayodhya, did not turn up. "Because they were scared of losing their vote bank, but we are not afraid," the Home Minister said. "Prime Minister Narendra Modi built the Kashi Vishwanath corridor which was destroyed by Aurangzeb. Bomb blasts were happening almost every day when the Manmohan Singh-led government was in the Centre. Mumbai was also shaken by explosions. When Prime Minister Narendra Modi was in power, terrorists attacked Uri and Pulwama. In just 10 days, our military forces entered Pakistan and carried out surgical strikes and air strikes, and wiped out the terrorists," HM Amit Shah said.

Senior citizen loses Rs 1.90 lakh to cyber fraud

A 65-year-old man was allegedly duped by a cyber fraudster who posed as a Mumbai Police official on the phone and forced him to transfer Rs 1.90 lakh in a bank account threatening action for 'money laundering', reported news agency. The complainant received a call on April 25 from an unknown number. The caller claimed he was a police inspector from the cyber police station in Andheri, Mumbai. He told the complainant that he was involved in money laundering activities, a Nagpur Police official said on Sunday. "The complainant panicked and made an online transfer of Rs 1.90 lakh in the bank account on directions of the caller," he said. The man later realised that he had been cheated and approached police. A case has been registered under the provisions of the Indian Penal Code and the Information Technology Act.

Huge cash-flow in Maha LS polls, alleges MVA

The Opposition Maha Vikas Aghadi leaders claimed that large amounts of cash were reportedly being transferred to and fro, ostensibly to buy votes in the Lok Sabha elections, even as anti-graft crusader Anna Hazare frowned at the developments while the MahaYuti flatly dismissed the allegations, here on Monday. Crying foul, Shiv Sena (UBT) MP Sanjay Raut, Nationalist Congress Party (SP) MLA Rohit R. Pawar and Congress MLA Ravindra Dhangekar who is contesting from Pune, hurled the allegations targeting the ruling alliance of Shiv Sena-Bharatiya Janata Party-Nationalist Congress Party in Pune, Ahmednagar and Nashik Lok Sabha constituencies. Posting a purported video of Chief Minister Eknath Shinde alighting from a helicopter in Nashik with two security personnel lugging at least two heavy bags, Raut demanded to know why the CM travelled with such bulky luggage for just a two-hour-long poll campaign trip. Rohit R. Pawar posted another supposed video showing bundles of cash lying on a road in the Ahmednagar LS constituency and claimed that it contained 'prasad' for disbursing among the voters. "Today, a packet arrived here in the name of everyone called 'Raja' with the 'prasad' and a plea by the guardian min-



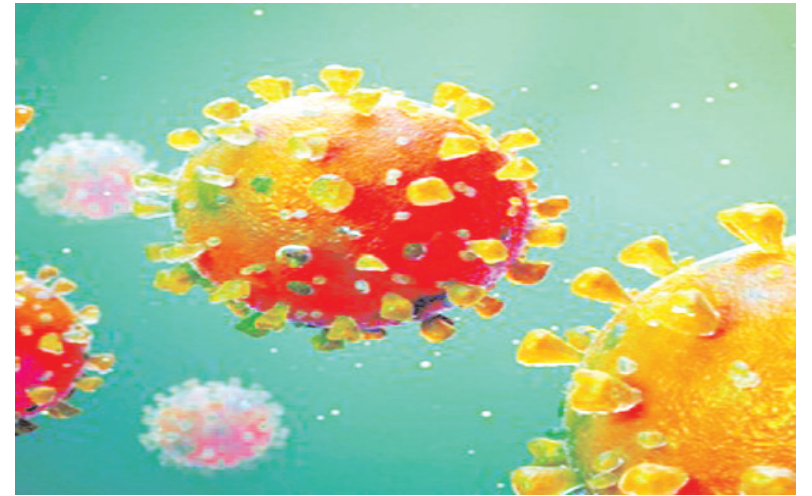
ister to vote for his party. The irony is that in many villages, the local refused to accept the 'prasad' and in others, the village elders siphoned off half the 'prasad'," said Rohit R. Pawar in a jibe at the BJP's LS candidate from Ahmednagar Dr Sujay R. Vikhe-Patil, who is battling against NCP (SP)'s challenger Nilesh D. Lanke. Dhangekar alleged that last night in Pune, a large amount of cash was distributed during the weekend to lure the voters in the Sahakar Nagar slums in his constituency reportedly supporters of the ruling MahaYuti. Early on Monday, he and hundreds of MVA activists had gathered to lodge a police complaint which was not accepted ostensibly due to lack of evidence. Raut claimed that as per his information, the bags hauled by the CM's security personnel may have been filled with "around Rs 12-13 crore" and demanded a statement from the government. Rohit R. Pawar said more complaints of 'prasad' packets are pouring in and

alleged that there are reports of more than Rs 2,000 crore cash being splurged by the ruling side to get votes and buy out leaders of opposition parties. Responding to the developments, anti-corruption crusader Anna Hazare appeared sad and termed it as regretful besides posing a 'threat to the survival of democracy'. "If money power enters into the election arena in this way then democracy will be finished, only autocracy will remain," he warned, after casting his vote in the Ahmednagar LS constituency. On his part, Ahmednagar BJP candidate Dr Sujay Vike-Patil hit back saying it was a planned operation to create confusion in the minds of voters. He also referred to an incident in the 2019 LS elections when some employees of the Rohit R. Pawar-headed Baramati Agro Co. were caught distributing cash for votes and a case was registered in the matter. State BJP President Chandrashekar Bawankule dismissed the MVA's contentions saying, "they are starting at defeat in the allegations and hence it is not surprising that they are levelling such baseless charges". Shiv Sena's Sanjay Shirsat also rubbished the MVA allegations and said that this is an attempt to divert attention from the impending defeat of the Opposition parties.

As Maha detects 91 FLiRT Covid cases, expert rules out any immediate concern

Even as the 91 cases of new FLiRT Covid-19 variants, accounting for more than a third of cases in the US, have reportedly been detected in Maharashtra, there is nothing to worry immediately, a top expert said on Sunday. The new set of variants dubbed FLiRT, majorly includes KP.1.1, and KP2 strains. These are named based on the technical names for their mutations, one of which includes the letters "F" and "L", and another of which includes the letters "R" and "T". Genome sequencing of March and April showed that Maharashtra has 91 cases of KP2 -- Pune (51), Thane (20), Amravati (7) Aurangabad (7), Solapur (2), Ahmednagar (1), Nashik (1), Latur (1), and Sangli (1). "What we see now, is the result of genome sequencing of the last two months, that is March and April. So, there is no cause of concern immediately as out of the 91 cases, not a single death, hospitalisation, or severe disease has been reported," infectious disease expert Dr Ishwar Gilada, told reporter. "Even the test positivity rate is around 1 per cent," he added. Dr Rajesh Karyakarte, Maharashtra's genome sequencing coordinator, said that KP2 has become the predominant Covid strain in the state. However, there hasn't been a corresponding increase in hospitalisations or



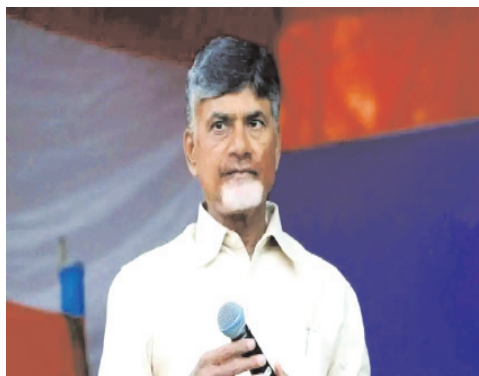
severe cases, The Times of India reported. FLiRT variants come from the lineage of the highly transmissible and immune system-evading Omicron. First identified globally in January, KP2 is a descendant of Omicron's JN.1. According to the data from the US Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, KP2 accounted for about one in four or 25 per cent of new sequenced cases in the country in the last weeks of April. Similar to previous variants, the symptoms typically include a sore throat, runny nose, congestion, tiredness, fever (with or without chills), headache, muscle pain, and sometimes loss of taste or smell.

"Covid has not gone away, but it is not creating any havoc. It is not creating any hospitalisation or deaths, and it is much milder than the flu. So, it should not be considered a separate disease. It should be considered like the flu and we can call it Covi-flu," said Dr Gilada, Consultant in Infectious Diseases Unison Medicare and Research Centre, Mumbai. However, he called for proper whole genome sequencing. "Though the variant will become prominent in numbers, it is not causing a surge in demand for oxygen, beds, ICUs, or ventilators, and there are also no deaths. "So, I think we should not be worried and concentrate on other emerging health problems," he said.

Bombay HC denies ex-AP CM Chandrababu Naidu's plea to quash assault case

The Bombay High Court's Aurangabad bench has dismissed a motion to dismiss a case against former Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister N Chandrababu Naidu and TDP leader Nakka Ananda Babu for allegedly attacking police officers in Maharashtra in 2010. In their ruling on May 10, Justices Mangesh Patil and Shailesh Brahmne noted that there was strong evidence linking both Naidu and Babu to the alleged crime. According to the report, the HC dismissed petitions filed by Telugu Desam Party (TDP) head Naidu and Babu seeking to overturn an FIR lodged against them by the Dharmabad police in Maharashtra's Nanded district. The FIR contained allegations of attacking or using criminal force against a public worker, inflicting harm with dangerous weapons, reckless case risking the life of others, malicious insult with the goal to create a breach of peace, and criminal intimidation, the news agency report stated. The bench emphasised that witness accounts directly linked Naidu and Babu in the offence,



while medical certifications confirmed the injuries inflicted by multiple police officers. "The FIR expressly alleges about the applicant accused no. 1 (Naidu) having instigated fellow prisoners and even threatened of there being a war between the two states," the HC said and added, "It is clear that the offence was committed by sharing a common intention to carry out assault on police

personnel." The HC further added, "The FIR was lodged promptly and even the injured police personnel were medically examined immediately." "There is enough material revealing complicity of the applicants (Naidu and Babu) in commission of the crime with which they have been charged and it would not be appropriate to quash the crime and the criminal case," the high court said, per the report. According to the report, Despite objections from the defendants' counsel, Sidharth Luthra, the court affirmed the accusations, citing that the Prisons Act did not give grounds for dismissing the FIR. In July 2010, Dharmabad police arrested Naidu and Babu, along with 66 others, in connection with another protest and agitation case. During their detention, they allegedly refused to cooperate with authorities and incited war amongst states. While Luthra claimed that the claims were untrue and fabricated, the court ruled that the charges under the Indian Penal Code were separate from the Prisons Act, dismissing the request to dismiss the case. The court granted Naidu and Babu interim protection until July 8, as asked by their counsel.

Former Air Force chief Air Chief Marshal Pradeep Vasant Naik on Monday expressed surprise over the name of his wife Madhubala having been deleted from the voters list. ACM Naik, 75, along with his wife and son Vineet, 43, went to vote at polling booth 26 at Sampling School Baner Road in Pune on Monday morning as soon as voting began. "While I and my son were able to vote, my 72-year-old wife's name was found deleted from the voters list. When we brought this to the attention of the official there, he said that there was nothing he could do to help," ACM Naik said. "We are disappointed. Several such deletions were noticed in the list. It must be found out as to why such deletions are happening," he said. "We had the necessary slips given by the

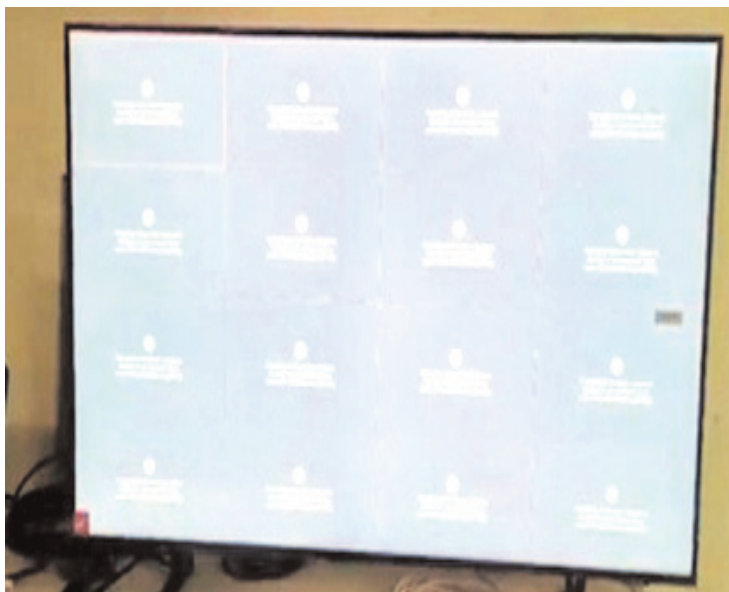


local corporator with us when we reached the polling centre. But it was of no use as my wife's name was not there in the list," the former IAF chief said. After the death of his sitting Pune MP Girish Bapat, the BJP has fielded former mayor Murlidhar Mohol from Pune Lok Sabha constituency. The Congress has fielded Ravindra Dhangekar, who defeated the BJP in the Kasba assembly bypoll last year.

NCP (SP) furious as Baramati EVMs' strongroom CCTV blanks for 45 minutes

In a bizarre development, the CCTV in an EVM strongroom for the Baramati Lok Sabha constituency, allegedly went blank for some 45 minutes, raising howls of protest from the Opposition Nationalist Congress Party (SP), here on Monday. The elections for the prestigious Baramati LS seat were held on May 7 in the third phase of polling along with 10 other constituencies, after which all the EVMs from across the constituency were shifted to the secure strongroom till the counting of votes scheduled on June 4. It was the NCP (SP) worker who first noticed the purported breakdown of the CCTV - long considered a 'neutral third-party eye' - this morning in the EVMs warehouse. Suspecting something amiss, he quickly raised a hue and cry and even complained to the local concerned officials and the party higher-ups on the matter.



NCP (SP) Working President Supriya Sule, who is in the race for the Baramati seat opposite her sister-in-law, Sunetra A. Pawar, wife of Nationalist Congress Party chief Ajit Pawar, has cried foul at the latest development. "It is highly suspicious that the CCTV is switched off where a very important device like the EVMs are

kept. This is big laxity on the part of the authorities," she fumed on social media, posting a purported video of the incident. She pointed out that when her election representatives brought the matter to the notice of the concerned authorities and the administration, "they did not get any satisfactory reply." "Besides, there was no technician available at the place, our representatives were not allowed to inspect the EVM's status. This is very serious and suspicious," said Sule, daughter of NCP (SP) President Sharad Pawar. Sule demanded that the Election Commission of India (ECI) should immediately take notice of this and reveal the reasons why the CCTVs were shut down and take appropriate action against those responsible for the lapse. There has been no reaction to the development from Sunetra A. Pawar's side so far on the accusations today - a week after the polls which turned into a fight for supremacy between the Pawar clan's famous uncle-nephew duo.

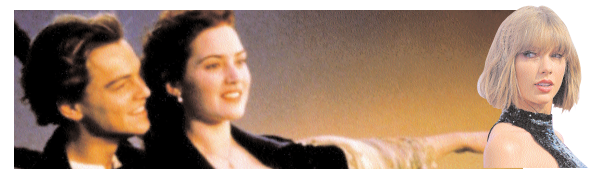
After cutting b'day cake, Maha BJP MP Raksha N. Khadse takes blessings for a hat-trick feat

After a goalless 120 minutes, Haryana's Shreya Hooda made a fine save, before Dular Marandi hit the post for Bengal to seal the result. Haryana are now through to their second consecutive Senior Women's NFC final and will hope to better their runners-up finish from last year.

Ravi Kumar Punia's side will face Manipur in the final on May 15, who defeated defending champions Tamil Nadu 2-0 earlier on Monday. Sibani Devi and Bala Devi scored for Manipur.

The contest began in frenetic fashion, with attacks from both sides. Varshika's goal-line block and a few good saves from India international Shreya Hooda prevented an early Bengal opener. Haryana mostly rallied forward on the wings, utilising their pacy wingers to build attacks from crosses and cutbacks.

However, their finishing let them down a bit in the first half. Senior



India striker Renu and youth international Varshika each sent a header wide, while Neha hit the side netting, missing the bottom corner by a whisker. Sunita Munda also had a great chance for Bengal as a rebound fell kindly on her feet, but she could only shoot straight at Hooda from six yards out.

A different and more offensive Bengal side came out of the tunnel

after the break. Haryana remained pegged back in their own half, while the hosts launched wave after wave of attacks. The best of the lot fell for skipper Sangita Basfore who fluffed her lines from just six yards out in the 61st minute, hitting the side-netting with just Hooda to beat.

The pendulum of momentum shifted once again as Haryana tried to get a foothold with some substitu-

tions. In the 68th minute, Neha's glancing header off Rajni Bala's cross from the right went wide.

Haryana crafted a similar move deep in added time as Bala, once again looking for Neha, swung in a cross, this time from her left foot. But goalkeeper Manju was alert and punched the cross away confidently.

The 30 minutes of extra time did not see as much goalmouth action, and it remained scoreless with neither team creating any notable threat. From the penalty spot, Anay Bai, Shailja and Neha all converted for Haryana, while Poonam Sharma, Mugli Saren and Sangita Basfore did the same for Bengal.

It remained 3-3 before Ngangom Anibala Devi saw her low shot to Hooda's left saved by the Haryana custodian. Bengal got a chance to stay alive when Rajni Bala struck Haryana's fourth penalty onto the crossbar. However, Dular Marandi was unable to capitalise for Bengal as she also hit the right post with Bengal's fifth and final penalty.

Haryana will face Manipur in the final of the 28th Senior Women's National Football Championship for Rajmata Jijabai Trophy at the Kishore Bharati Krirangan here on Wednesday.

Moody backs Rohit & Hardik to regain form ahead of T20 WC

Mumbai Indians' (MI) IPL 2024 campaign was majorly overshadowed by the Rohit Sharma-Hardik Pandya debacle with both players being criticised individually as well as for their impact on the team.

However, former Australian cricketer Tom Moody has backed the two players to regain form ahead of the T20 World Cup, starting from June 1 in "I wouldn't be overly concerned with Rohit Sharma's form at this stage. When it comes to representing his country for major events like an ICC World Cup, I see the experience of Rohit Sharma as invaluable not just with the bat but as the captain as well."

"When it comes to form for players like Rohit Sharma, the way the event is structured there's a number of games in the group stage for players to find some form against less competitive sides," Moody, cricket expert and commentator with official TV broadcaster Star Sports for IPL 2024, told IANS in an exclusive chat.

"When it comes to individual form or team form momentum can be captured quite early and then the team will be peaking at the right time when it comes to the back end of the tournament," he said.

Hardik, on the other hand, has had a rollercoaster of a season which began with him being booed at the Narendra Modi Stadium in their opening match against his former team, Gujarat



Titans.

The 30-year old all-rounder is averaging only 18.18 runs a game which has fallen down from 31.45 in the previous edition. Alongside his average batting stats, he is also leaking way too many runs. His economy of 10.59 in this edition of the tournament is the worst it has been in the ten years he has played in the tournament.

"Same answer as Rohit, they're both having challenging times when it comes to their franchise and Hardik is obviously a critical part of that side, because in ICC events you don't have impact players so your all rounders are important when it comes

to creating balance in your playing XI. I am sure Hardik Pandya will benefit from those early games getting some sort of momentum and confidence back into his game, more so with the bat than ball.

"In recent games he has found some sort of rhythm and form with the ball in hand. T20 can be quite a fickle format when it comes to batting in the middle order or as a player, who comes in the back end of the innings. I am sure he will have his moments in those first few games to recapture some sort of form into his batting," added Moody.

BUTTLER, JACKS, TOPLEY TRAVEL BACK TO ENGLAND FOR T20I SERIES AGAINST PAKISTAN

Jos Buttler, Will Jacks and Reece Topley have travelled back to England leaving the Indian Premier League (IPL) 2024 midway for their respective franchises for the T20I series against Pakistan. England will be hosting Pakistan in a four-match T20I series starting on May 22 at Leeds.

After Punjab Kings all-rounder Liam Livingstone flew back to England on Monday evening to get his "knee sorted out", England T20 World Cup skipper Jos Buttler and Royal Challengers Bengaluru (RCB) players Reece Topley and Will Jacks also travelled back to England for the preparation for World Cup.

Buttler's Rajasthan Royals are in the second position on the IPL points table and will play their last two league matches against Punjab Kings (PBKS) and Kolkata Knight Riders (KKR) on May 15 and 19 respectively. Buttler has scored 359 runs from 11 games at an average of 39.88 and a strike-rate of

140.78 with 2 hundreds.

The Royals dropped a post on 'X' where Buttler was seen leaving the team, RR wrote, "We'll miss you, Jos bhai!" Bengaluru too will miss the services of Will Jacks and Reece Topley in the virtual quarterfinal against Chennai Super Kings, scheduled on May 18.

KKR might also miss the services of Phil Salt for the Play-offs who is also expected to leave in the coming days. Salt has amassed 435 runs at a strike rate of 182 in just 12 matches.

Moeen Ali of Chennai Super Kings will also be unavailable for the playoffs while his participation in the crucial clash with Royal Challengers Bengaluru (RCB) on May 18 at the Chinnaswamy Stadium in Bengaluru.

Manu Bhaker and Adarsh Singh topped the qualification rounds of the women's 25m pistol and men's 25m

rapid-fire pistol (RFP) Olympic Selection Trial (OST) T4 respectively, as all five athletes in the event heading into the final to be held at the MP State Shooting Academy ranges on Tuesday morning.

The men went first as Anish Bhanwala took a healthy four-point lead from the first precision stage into the second rapid-fire stage, only to be pipped by Adarsh on countback, after both posted scores of 583 with the same number of 24-hits in the inner 10-ring.

Ankur Goel too shot the same score but had 10 fewer hits in the inner ring, while Vijayveer Sidhu clinched fourth with a 581, scoring just one inner-10 more than Bhavesh Shekhawat.

Olympian Manu Bhaker in the women's 25m Pistol, also pipped Esha Singh on inner-10s after both shot an identical 586. Rhythm Sangwan came in third while Abhidnya Patil (582) and Simranpreet Kaur Brar (564) were fourth and fifth respectively.

On pure calculations and taking the best of three scores, Manu Bhaker and Esha Singh take the top two spots in the women's event, while Anish Bhanwala and Vijayveer Sidhu are 1-2 in the men's RFP, irrespective of what happens in the finals.

The final team for the Paris Olympics will however only be declared after a meeting of the selection committee post the trials.

McIlroy turns 2-shot deficit into 5-shot win for 4th Wells Fargo title

Rory McIlroy overturned a two-shot deficit as he played his final 11 holes in six-under to win the Wells Fargo Championships by a whopping five shots despite a closing double bogey.

The 35-year-old Northern Irishman produced a stunning burst of golf by landing two eagles and four birdies over an eight-hole stretch from Hole No. 8 to breeze to his second win of the season. He also won the Hero Dubai Desert Classic on the DP World Tour and was third at the Texas Open. Korea's Byeong Hun An (66) was third at 9 under, and Jason Day (70) and Sungjae Im tied for fourth a 6-under.

Indian-Americans Sahithi Theegala (72) at 8-over was T-52 and Akshay Bhatia (74) was 5-over and 42nd. Both will head to the PGA Championships at Valhalla next.

McIlroy won the Wells Fargo for a record fourth time even as no other player has won the event more than twice. It was his second straight PGA Tour event after partnering Shane Lowry to take the Zurich Classic two weeks ago in New Orleans. It was also



his 26th PGA Tour win.

The two wins in two starts should give McIlroy ideal momentum heading to Kentucky for the PGA Championship at Valhalla Golf Club, the site of his last major win 10 years ago.

"I really got some confidence," McIlroy said. "My golf swing feels a

lot more comfortable than it has. So going to a venue next week where I've won, it feels like the stars are lining a little bit. But I've got a lot of golf to play and a lot of great players to try to beat next week. Going into the next major of the year feeling really good about myself."

McIlroy has often called Quail

Hollow one of his favourite courses because it allows for him to take advantage of his length off the tee. But it was his putting that won him the 26th career PGA TOUR title Sunday. He needed just 25 putts, making five longer than 10 feet.

Schauffele finished second for the second straight year and saw his winless drought stretch to 39 tournaments, a streak dating to 2022. He led by four shots after 36 holes.

An set himself up for a strong showing at the upcoming PGA Championship, the year's second major. The 32-year-old An hit an impressive seven birdies against two bogeys at Quail Hollow Club in Charlotte, North Carolina to post his career best score in the US\$20 million tournament even though he finished a distant eight shots back of runaway winner, Rory McIlroy.

It was his fifth top-10 of the season, and second in successive weeks after a T4 in The CJ Cup Byron Nelson last weekend.
