The BJP, which was aiming for 370 seats, and set the NDA a target of 400-plus, appears to be running way behind, let down by Uttar Pradesh, which sends a whopping 80 lawmakers to the Lok Sabha. At 8 pm, the BJP was ahead on 241 seats, the NDA on 291. The INDIA bloc is ahead on 232 seats, the Congress on 100, till the time of going for print. The BJP applecart appears to have been upset by the heartland state of Uttar Pradesh, which has pushed the INDIA bloc -- Samajwadi Party and the Congress -- ahead in 44 of 80 seats at 7 pm. The BJP is leading on 32. The BJP had swept Uttar Pradesh in 2014 and held of its ground in 2019. This time most exit polls had predicted an edge for the party.

#### INDIA HAVE BROKEN THE BACKBONE **OF BJP: MAMATA BANERJEE**

Kolkata: The people of India, especially those in West Bengal, have broken the backbone of the BJP, West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee claimed on Tuesday after the trends coming out of the Election Commission data showed that the Trinamool Congress is heading for victory in 29 out of the 42 Lok Sabha seats



According to the Chief Minister, had the BJP got majority without the help of its allies, the country would have ased to exist "The NDA is a lost case now. Some other parties might still be considering supporting the BJP, but I will request them not to do so. I think the Modi magic is finished, and he should resign," the Chief Minister said.

Speaking to mediapersons here, the Chief Minister said that since the BJP has not secured an absolute majority on its own, the coming days will be tough for the party.

"They have already committed enough excesses on us for which we will never forgive them. I think the other allies of the INDIA bloc will also not forgive them" CM

2019, leading in only 11 seats at 3 pm. Mamata Banerjee's Trinamool Congress appears to have recovered much of the lost ground and is ahead in 31 seats.

who sought votes in his name. "Congress fought the elections under highly adverse situations. Our bank accounts and funds were blocked while those raising their voices against the oppressive regime were silenced. Yet, we kept up the fight and put up a strong opposition against the oppressive regime," Kharge said.

Heaping praise on Rahul Gandhi's energetic and spirited campaign ahead of the elections, the Congress chief said, "Rahul Gandhi's twin Yatras proved instrumental in not only reviving the fortunes of the Congress, but also in restricting the BJP's march to

#### **BIGGEST MARKET FALL IN 4 YEARS**

Mumbai: Jitters of counting day led the Indian indices to experience their biggest fall in the last four years on Tuesday with the investors losing nearly Rs 30 lakh crore in a single season. As the counting for the Lok Sabha polls entered the final phase, Sensex closed 4,389 points down, or 5.74 per cent, at 72,079, while Nifty



shed 1,379 points, or 5.93 per cent, to close at 21,884 on

Nifty Bank suffered a loss of over 4,051 points, or 7.95 per cent, to close at 46,928. Hindustan Unilever Limited (HUL), Hero MotoCorp, Britannia, Nestle, and Divis Labs were among the top gainers on Nifty, while ONGC, Coal India, and SBI suffered the most. Except for FMCG stocks which outperformed on a poor day for investors, all other sectoral indices traded in deep red, with realty, telecom, metal, oil & Dank down more than 10 per

The BSE midcap and smallcap indices were down 7-8 per cent.Experts said that the market, which had begun to price in a landslide victory for the NDA, witnessed a significant correction due to margin calls, as the retail investors were carrying heavily leveraged positions.

"Immediate support is visible at the psychological level of 22,000, below which the index might fall further towards 21.400-21,500. Recovery looks possible once the trend moves in favour of the BJP winning the elections comfortably," said Rupak De, senior technical analyst at LKP Securities. The unexpected outcome of the general elections sparked a wave of fear selling in the domestic market, reversing the recent substantial rally.

rime Minister Narendra Modi has won the Varanasi Lok Sabha seat for a third time even though his National Democratic Alliance (NDA) was staring at a shocking result in politically important Uttar Pradesh, the BJP's big bastion in the past two general elections.

PM Modi defeated Congress' Ajay Rai by over 1.5 lakh votes, but the state is currently witnessing an epic neck-and-neck battle between the ruling NDA and the opposition INDIA bloc comprising Samajwadi Party and Congress. According to the latest Election Commission figures, the NDA has so far won 26 seats and is leading in 10.

The INDIA bloc, on the other hand, made big gains and secured 29 seats and was ahead in 14.

While the Akhilesh Yadavled Samajwadi Party contested 62 seats, the Congress fought 17. In the 2019 Lok Sabha elections, the BJP alone won 62 of the 80 seats, while the BSP and Samajwadi Party, then allies, won 10 and five seats, respec-

Despite counting of votes still underway, the picture of parties who got a major share of votes in this election is fairly clear.

According to the election commission of India, BJP is running ahead with the biggest share of votes at 36.76%, followed by the Congress at 21.46%.

Both the leading parties have more or less maintained their vote shares as compared to 2019. The BJP has almost held on to its 2019 vote share of 37%. The Congress has so far made a slight improvement of 1.46% as compared to 2019's 20% vote share.

The BJP has so far won 239 seats and is eye ing a third term in the power, a decline from 2019's 303 seats. The Congress, on the other



hand, has made a big gain by almost doubling its standing in the Lok Sabha since the last time. The Congress has won 100 seats as compared to 52 seats in 2019.

The vote share this year has dropped other three parties that made a place for

The other two big parties in the NDA are Eknath Shinde's Shiv Sena, which is leading in six seats, and Chirag Paswan's Lok Janshakti Party, which is ahead in five.

Moves for government formation have already begun and sources have told a channel that BIP President IP Nadda has called a meeting of the NDA today. Both Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Home Minister Amit Shah have also spoken to Naidu and the PM has also told the TDP leader that he will attend his swearing-in ceremony as the Andhra Pradesh chief minister on

A BJP meeting is also underway at Nadda's residence, with Shah, Defence Minister Rajnath Singh and other senior leaders in attendance. PM Modi is also expected to visit the BJP headquarters around 7 pm.

Jagan Mohan Reddy sent his resignation to Governor S. Abdul Nazeer, the YSR Congress Party said on Tuesday.

The Governor may ask him to continue as the caretaker Chief Minister till his successor

Jagan Mohan Reddy sent his resignation a few minutes after addressing a press conference. He stated that the results were unexpected for the party. He wondered why the YSR Congress suffered defeat despite implementing several welfare schemes, benefiting crores of people.

## BJP wins 24 seats, leading in 56; BJD gets 18

he BJP won 24 assembly seats in Odisha on Tuesday and was leading in 56 other constituencies, according to the Election Commission

Odisha chief minister and BJD supremo Naveen Patnaik was trailing BJP's Laxman Bag by 10,460 votes in the Kantabanji assembly seat in Bolangir

The BJD supremo was leading by 4,355 votes over his BJP rival Sisir Kumar Mishra in the Hinjili seat, the other seat he is contesting in Ganjam district.

The Congress won two seats and was ahead in 12 Assembly segments.

Odisha, traditionally a stronghold of Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik's BJD, is witnessing a fierce contest as the BJP seeks to make significant gains in both



the Assembly and General elections. Reflecting on the 2019 Lok Sabha

results, the BJD won 12 seats, the BJP secured 8, and the Congress managed to win just 1 out of 21 seats. This year's exit polls indicate a potential shift, with ABP-CVoter predicting 17-19 seats for the BJP and India Today-My Axis forecasting 18-20 seats for the party.

Key candidates from the state include Pratap Sarangi (Balasore), Manju Lata Mandal (Bhadrak), Sarmistha Sethi (Jajpur), and Rajashree Mallick Jagatsinghpur). Prominent BJD figures in the fray are Odisha Assembly Speaker Pramila Mallik, Government Chief Whip Prashant Kumar Muduli, and state ministers Sudam Marandi, Ashwini Patra, Pritiranjan Ghadai, Atanu S Nayak,

Pratap Deb, and T K Behera. The voting for the Odisha assembly polls was conducted in four phases from May 13 to June 1, simultaneously with the Lok Sabha elections.

## Reprieve to Congress govt in Himachal as party wins four out of six bypolls

n a major reprieve to the Congress government led by Sukhvinder Sukhu in Himachal Pradesh, the party on Tuesday won four out of six bypolls.

However, it lost all four Lok Sabha seats to the BJP for the third time in a row.

The bypolls were necessitated as the sitting Congress MLAs cross-voted in the Rajya Sabha polls and were later suspended from the party. They resigned from the house and joined the BJP and were fielded by it.

With four new legislators,

the Congress has stabilised its government in the state.

Two sitting legislators won their seats again. They were Sudhir Sharma from Dharamsala and Inder Dutt Lakhanpal from Barsar, both once lovalists of Congress stalwart and sixtime Chief Minister Virbhadra Singh, who

passed away in 2022. Apart from them, the Congress' Anuradha Rana won the Lahaul-Spiti Assembly constituency, Rakesh Kalia the Gagret seat, Captain Ranjit Singh Rana from Sujanpur, and Vivek Sharma from Kutlehar. The entry of four

new Congress legislators

into the Assembly comes just a day after Speaker Kuldeep Pathania accepted the resignation of three Independent MLAs, who too had voted along with six Congress legislators in favour of the BJP candidate in the recently held Rajya Sabha election.

The resignations of Hoshiyar Singh (Dehra), Ashish Sharma (Hamirpur), and K.L. Thakur (Nalagarh) were accepted and their seats fell vacant from Monday, a notification by the Assembly Secretariat said.

Currently, the Congress has 34 legislators, while the BJP has 25.

## MAHARASHTRA: CONGRESS RISES LIKE A PHOENIX; MVA CRUSHES MAHAYUTIA

fter a decade on the political pavements, the Maharashtra Congress unexpectedly resurrected itself to emerge as the single largest party in the state, and with Maha Vikas Aghadi allies, crushed the ruling MahaYuti in the Lok Sabha 2024 results declared on Tuesday.

As per the latest trends/results for the 48 Lok Sabha constituencies officially available, the MVA has secured 29 seats, the MahaYuti bagged 18 and one went to a Congress rebel-turned-independent Vishal P. Patil in Sangli.

Among the two blocs, the MVA's Congress has bagged 12, up from two in 2014 and one in 2019, Shiv Sena (UBT)'s 10, Nationalist Congress Party (SP)'s 7; and the MahaYuti's Bharatiya Janata Party managed 11, Shiv Sena's 6 and Nationalist Congress Party's just one.

Notably, Pratap Bhanu Sharma of Congress won from Vidisha in two general elections -- 1980 and 1984.

While the BJP has retained this high-profile Vidisha Lok Sabha seat since 1989. Former Prime Minister Atal Bihari Vajpayee and another BJP stalwart Sushma Swaraj had represented this seat.

Before becoming the Chief Minister of Madhya Pradesh in 2005, Shivraj Singh Chouhan won four terms from Vidisha.

After the BJP won the assembly election in November last year, the BJP replaced Chouhan with Mohan Yaday as Chief Minister. Subsequently, Chouhan was fielded



from Vidisha again and he won. After winning the election, Chouhan said, "I express my gratitude to the people of Vidisha for supporting the BJP. People of Madhya Pradesh and from the entire country have shown faith in Prime Minister

Chouhan further said he was happy to receive a massive mandate and promised that he would continue to serve the people of Vidisha.

## BJP wins big in Kamal Nath's bastion Chhindwara

elebrations have begun in the Madhya Pradesh unit of the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) as the party is set to sweep all the 29 Lok Sabha seats in the

However, what is more important for the BJP is that it has wrested Chhindwara from the Congress, the only seat in MP the BJP could not win since 1997.

In Chhindwara, BJP's Vivek 'Bunty' Sahu has won by over 1.3 lakh votes against his nearest rival and sitting Congress MP Nakul Nath, the son of party veteran Kamal Nath.A low-profile BJP leader, Sahu had unsuccessfully contested his first elections against Kamal Nath



in the Assembly bypoll from Chhindwara in 2019.

The BJP had fielded him again against Kamal Nath in the Assembly elections held in November last year, but he lost again.

However, despite two consecutive defeats, the BJP reposed faith in him to take on the Kamal Nath family from Chhindwara by fielding him against Nakul Nath. Sahu got an edge after Kamal Nath's close aide Deepak Saxena left the Congress and joined the BJP a few days before voting was held in Chhindwara.

Chhindwara has been the bastion of Kamal Nath since 1980. The family won as many as 13 elections from the seat since then (11 Lok Sabha and 3 Assembly polls).

Kamal Nath represented Chhindwara for a record nine times, while his wife Alka Nath won this seat in 1996.The Jan Sangh's Sundarlal Patwa (ex-CM) had won Chhindwara in 1997, which was the only win for the BJP from this seat, before Sahu helped the party wrest the seat from the



Thile the BJP has won all the 29 Lok Sabha seats in Madhya Pradesh, an interesting phenomenon is being observed in Indore where 1,82,766 voters opted for the NOTA (None of the Above) option (till 1.10 p.m.), setting a new record.

While the BJP's Shankar Lalwani has taken a decisive lead of over 8 lakh votes in Indore, the second-highest

votes so far have been counted in favour of NOTA.

NOTA, or the option to express one's displeasure with every candidate in the fray, was introduced in most Indian elections since 2013.

However, across Madhya Pradesh, the BJP is upbeat as their candidates are in the lead in all the 29 seats in the state, including in Chhindwara, the only constituency it lost to the Congress in 2019.

#### Shift in Dalit politics

he Bahujan Samaj Party has sunk and a new Dalit leader has risen in the Lok Sabha elections in Uttar Pradesh. This is the biggest takeaway of these elections from the state. Bahujan Samaj Party (BSP) has failed to win even a single seat in Uttar Pradesh while Chandrashekhar of Aazad Samaj Party (Kanshi Ram) and founder of Bhim Party was leading massively in the Nagina seat without any support from any political party or leader. His victory with a margin of over one lakh votes in Nagina, a reserved seat, signifies a clear shift in Dalit votes. The BSP had also fielded its candidate in Nagina and Akash Anand, when he campaigned there, targeted Chandrashekhar and warned his voters to beware of 'woh aadmi'. Chandrashekhar fought a lonely battle but he was confident of his victory. "All parties have positioned themselves against me but the people are with me and I am confident of their support," he said two days ago. Though Chandrashekhar carefully avoided any criticism of Mayawati, he ensured that the voters realised the difference between the two. A Bhim Army supporter explained, "Chandrashekhar has always made sure to visit every Dalit home where any member has been targeted. Mayawati has never bothered to reach out to families who suffer. People, especially youth, in our community are slowly gravitating towards the Bhim Army, also known as the Azad Samaj Party. Buoyed up by its leader's victory in Nagina, the Bhim Army now plans to build up its organisation across the state. As per the Election Commission data, Chandrashekhar was leading with a margin of 1,45,053 over his nearest rival,

## SANITY IS A PREREQUISITI **FOR PEACE**

ll conflicts -- interpersonal, social and political -- are traceable to lesser thoughts afflicting the human mind at The cost of sanity. Sanity is broadly the gain accruing from a combination of 'awareness' with 'acceptance' of the larger realities of life and a certain capacity to relentlessly follow the path of duty without the fear of failure. Life is not a journey entirely free of turbulence and these two precepts by and large provide a level of peace of mind that was the prime requisite for successfully negotiating that journey.

Indian spiritual thought upheld the primacy of mental peace over any other form of advantage in life and even prepared the individual to face the journey's end with calm and a healthy sense of 'surrender' to the higher order. This is what imbues the Indian mind with a sense of wisdom -- this was particularly true of the women of India -- and sees an individual preferring peace over want. It goes without saying that India surely is one country where this kind of intrinsic wisdom should come into play to make governance people-oriented going beyond what was done in a so-called 'welfare' state. The state has to nurse the spiritual gift of Indians that got them to opt for peace. We have changed our penal codes to free them of the colonial hangover. Of equal importance is the need for giving a suitable orientation to our national civil services to enable them to serve the larger objective of giving all citizens fair treatment within the firmness of the administrative ethos and contributing to policy-framing for the larger good of the nation. India upholds sanity in international relations as well which is why it has in a short period of time risen to become a major power in the world espousing the cause of global peace and human advancement. India's foreign policy of opting for bilateral and even multilateral friendships based on mutual security and economic benefits that did not prejudice global peace has in a way helped the country to reinforce its position as an independent-looking power in the comity of nations. Projection of the strategy of making India self-dependent in economy and defence has added to this image.

On the Ukraine-Russia military confrontation and more recently in the Israel-Hamas conflict India took a stand that seemed to indicate an approach of sanity befitting a world leader who could see things in the wider perspective of the good of humanity. In both these developments of geopolitical importance, India was upfront in suggesting negotiations for peace -- the initial condemnation of the 'terrorist' attack of Hamas on Israel on October 7 was in line with India's declared policy of zero tolerance towards 'terrorism' of all kinds.

Even in the Ukraine-Russia armed confrontation, India had reached out to the two countries at the highest levels to call for the cessation of hostilities and return to talks on the basis of the willingness of the mediators to understand the 'security concerns' of both sides. All this enabled India to continue with its bilateral friendship with both Russia and Israel without running into any problems with the rest of the international community. In handling geopolitical developments, India has apparently made the point that what was right from the point of view of the interests of humanity, was the correct policy for the simple reason that the voice of sanity would ultimately find



the widest global support.

In the governance of a large country like India, it becomes equally important that democratic dispensation prevails in all areas of domestic life like the execution of welfare schemes, the development of all regardless of caste, creed or region and access to the same justice for the high and the low. This is again because this was the approach of sanity and people never failed to see the merit of such a pathway. The areas where the government at the Centre had still to work were to ensure that a uniform level of law & amp; order maintenance was available to the citizens through the length and breadth of the country regardless of the federal polity prescribed by our Constitution, to provide for a satisfactory medical care facility all across the country and to organise free education up to the school level mandated by the Constitution.

The country should move towards declaring health and education as strategic sectors where the writ of the Centre would be equally important. The framing of the National Education Policy should have come earlier and its implementation was insisted upon because the responsibilities of the state in respect of education were supposed to stand above party politics. In fact in education and health, the Centre should have primary accountability just as was the case with the maintenance of internal security. Strategic affairs did not admit any political divergences in interpretation. Indian voters are a shrewd judge of the performance of the government at the Centre or in the states and they have exercised their electoral power effectively over the decades. They accept what makes sense to them and make an un-tinted evaluation of the rulers of the day. India is lucky to have people who value sanity on the issues of governance.

India is a land of multiple faiths and modes of worship but its governance does not carry any stamp of religion. This makes it so much superior to the fundamentalist regimes in its neighbourhood with a declared system of treatment of minorities that allowed the latter less than equal rights compared to Muslims. India houses more Muslims than what their number

was in Pakistan but has secularism built into its governance by way of the grant of an equal voting right under the Constitutional mandate of 'one man one vote', development policies of the state being open to all regardless of community and the same protection of law being provided to all citizens. Any flaws in this regard noticed locally can be fiercely opposed in the exercise of the freedom of lawful protest.

Political parties may be tempted to rely on communal appeals but beyond a point, this would attract adverse notice of law enforcement. Notions of supremacism of faith that lead to an attitude of 'rejectionism' towards other religions have often caused political separatism but that too was largely because of the manipulation by leaders. Indian democracy has passed the test of the validity of its electoral process -- what has made it possible is the vigilance of the electorate that was always very clear about the merits and inadequacies of the government of the day. The average Indian has enough sanity to retain his or her political judgment by even rising above the individual's personal concerns and recording his or her prefer ence for stability and security of the country

Indians have the civilisational legacy of living in harmony with others respecting their faiths and social practices -- this is the reason why the narrative of 'majoritarianism' built by interested lobbies had not brought many converts and the faith in the Constitution had held on. However, the legacy of politics of 'minorityism' keeps on getting revived from time to time though without making too much headway. All communities in India have the uncanny realisation that this was a practising democracy where a party would succeed only on genuine performance. This is a great tribute to the sanity of Indian voters.

The maxim of sanity for peace applies to the personal life more than it does to the social and political spheres of the individual's existence. It would be of great help if three civilisational learnings were put to good use while traversing through the journey of life -- a conscious effort to see that there was not too much serious 'unfinished business' at any point of time, a certain degree of awareness that excessive 'attachments' would not work and a willingness to have 'forgiveness' of all those one had dealt with perhaps not fairly. This is not a very big call to make for a sane mind that sees the importance of having an environment of goodwill around oneself. It is important to realise that a sane mind is a rational mind and that rationalisation is the gift of logic. A logical mind is thus the best evidence of sanity and also an instrument of right decision-making in all situations. It brings in peace when it is most needed -- in difficult moments of life. A rational thinking helps to keep away clogging thoughts of the 'after-life' and makes it easy to believe that life had a beginning and an inevitable end -- nothing more. In a strange way, a sane mind will thus bring in peace when it is most needed -- at the final destination. Values of sanity can be cultivated and practised in the lifetime and in fact, should be adopted as the guide for purposeful living.

## South Korea to use loudspeakers near North Korean border after suspension of military pact

Seoul | Agencies outh Korea's military on Tuesday said it remains operate mobile loudspeakers near the border with North Korea as Seoul took steps to fully suspend a 2018 inter-Korean military pact.

Earlier in the day, the Cabinet endorsed the suspension of the Comprehensive Military Agreement in response to the North's trash-carrying balloon campaign and jamming of GPS signals in recent days, Yonhap news agency reported. The motion will be sent to President Yoon Suk Yeol for signing, and the suspension will allow South Korea to resume large-scale military training near the border and restart loudspeaker propaganda broadcasts toward the

Joint Chiefs of Staff spokesperson Lee Sung-jun said various measures could be taken after the suspension, noting that the military has operated both fixed and mobile loudspeakers on the



front lines.

"Fixed loudspeakers need to be connected to power, and installing them could take hours to a few days," Lee told a regular briefing. "Mobile loudspeaker operations can be conducted right

The loudspeakers used to blare criticism of the Kim Jong-un regime's human rights abuses, news and Kpop songs, drawing angry responses from Pyongyang.

A government source said there appears to be no plan to immediately install the fixed equipment as such activities could heighten military tension, noting that the military will likely operate the mobile equipment first if

such broadcasts are resumed Meanwhile, Lee declined to elaborate on the measures the military could take after the pact's suspension but noted that they would depend on North Korea's

"There are things that we can immediately do, and we could make them public, and a lot of those things can be seen as largely depending on North Korea," he said.

The 2018 deal included setting up buffer zones around the border to suspend large-scale military drills, as well as banning "hostile" acts between the two Koreas, which restricted the loudspeaker broadcasts.

#### Russia imposes entry ban on some UK politicians, journalists and experts

Moscow | Agencies ussia has announced entry bans on several British politicians, journalists, and experts, the country's Foreign Ministry said on Monday.

"In response to the hostile actions of the UK, it was decided to include a number of representatives of the political establishment, the journalistic corps, and the expert community of the United Kingdom on Russia's entry ban list," the ministry said in a statement, Xinhua news agency reported.

The ban was due to their "implementation of London's anti-Russian policy" or "covering important social-political events in Russia in a negative way", it added.

The ministry also urged Britain to stop providing military support to Ukraine.

#### Israel announces deaths of another 4 hostages in Hamas captivity

he Israel Defense Forces (IDF) has said that they have confirmed the deaths of another four Israeli hostages taken to the Gaza Strip by Hamas on October 7, 2023, claiming the Gaza-ruling group is still holding their bodies.

IDF spokesman Daniel Hagari said on Monday that the Israeli forces estimate "that the four were killed together in the Khan Younis area several months ago" when the Israeli forces were operating there.

He noted that the confirmation of their deaths was based on intelligence information and was approved by an expert committee at the Health Ministry, Xinhua news agency reported. He added that the IDF is conducting a thorough investigation into the circumstances of their death and is examining all possibilities. The IDF identified the four victims as Amiram Cooper, Chaim Peri, Yoram Metzger and Nadav Popplewell.

Cooper, Peri and Metzger, in their 80s, were residents of Nir Oz near the Gaza Strip border



and were seen alive in a video released by Hamas in December. Popplewell, 51, was from the village of Nirim near Nir Oz. He was last seen alive in a video released by Hamas in early May. Earlier on Monday, the IDF announced that it had located and identified the body of 36-year-old medic Dolev Yehud in his village Nir Oz. Yehud, who had been considered taken hostage until Monday was killed by Hamas on October 7, according to the army. Currently, 124 Israeli hostages remain held in the Gaza Strip, with Israel declaring 43 of them dead.

over the systems," said novb Microsoft, alleged the complaint, is

trying to contractually dump most of its legal responsibilities under the GDPR on schools that provide Microsoft 365 Education services to their pupils or stu-



"This means, for example, that access requests to Microsoft go unanswered while schools have no realistic way of complying with such requests because they don't hold the necessary data," the

non-prift mentioned. Maartje de Graaf, data protection

lawyer at noyb, said that this take-it-orleave-it approach by software vendors such as Microsoft is shifting all GDPR responsibilities to schools.

Microsoft holds all the key information about data processing in its software, but is pointing the finger at schools when it comes to exercising rights. Schools have no way of complying with the transparency and information obligations," de Graaf said.

Microsoft provides such "vague information" that even a qualified lawyer can't fully understand how the company processes personal data in Microsoft 365 Education.

"It is almost impossible for children or their parents to uncover the extent of Microsoft's data collection," said de Graaf.

### Sukhoi Fighter Jet Crashes In Nashik, Pilot, Co-Pilot Eject Safely

Sukhoi-30MKI fighter jet crashed in a field in Maharashtra's Nashik today. The pilot and the copilot managed to eject safely but suffered minor injuries.

The plane crashed in a field near Shirasgaon village, a senior police officer said.

Visuals showed the plume of smoke billowing after the aircraft crashed in the field. The twin-engine aircraft was up in flames and a crowd gathered near the crash site.

The aircraft took off from Ozar in Maharashtra's Nashik and was on a test flight after being overhauled by the Hindustan Aeronautics Limited (HAL), sources said.

The pilots reported a technical snag in the aircraft. The Air Force, sources added.

Su-30MKI was presently not in the inventory of the Indian The police and emergency

services have reached the spot and medical treatment is being provided to the

pilots. The Su-30MKI uses the zero-zero NPP Zvezda K-36DM ejection seat built by Russia.

The zero-zero capability was developed to help pilots escape from unrecoverable situations during low-altitude or low-speed flights as well as ground mishaps during takeoff or landing. The feature is said to be one of the advanced ejection capabilities that allow pilots to leave

the eject safely. The ejection seat is part of the overall 'Egress' system, which means the "way to exit". The system includes explosives under the seat, the canopy, and parachutes. The angle of ejection is crucial.

The fighter jet moves forward

and the line of ejection is

perpendicular to it to move

the pilot away from the aircraft.

During ejection, the pilots experience high g-forces reaching up to 20 times the force experienced on earth, which can cause severe injuries and can even bar them from flying.

The extent of injuries suffered by the Su-30MKI pilots in today's crash is unclear.





ound 7 of the Norway Chess tournament witnessed gripping matches with tense moments that significantly impacted the standings as India's prodigy R Praggnanandhaa scored another upset by defeating world champion Ding Liren in the armageddon game and, Magnus Carlsen lost his armageddon game against Hikaru Nakamura on time. One of the highlights of the day was the match between Koneru Humpy and Vaishali R as Koneru Humpy scored the only classical victory of the day in both tournaments. With this loss, the former tournament leader Vaishali's winning chances have significantly decreased.

The world champion Ding Liren, who has been underperforming with four losses in a row, finally stopped the bleeding with a much-needed draw against India's Praggnanandhaa R. However, he missed a trick and lost the armageddon tie-breaker, with Pragg remaining on the third spot of the standings (11 points).

In the highly anticipated game



between Magnus Carlsen and Hikaru Nakamura, the classical game ended in a draw relatively quickly, as both sides avoided complicated positions. The armageddon tiebreak was one of the most intense games so far in the tournament, as Nakamura won when Carlsen's time ran out on the clock. This win brought Nakamura within half a point of Carlsen, who is leading the tournament with 13 points. Fabiano Caruana sacrificing his knight against Alireza Firouzja almost backfired but man-

aged to play a draw in classical chess before the latter gave no chances in the decider.

In the Norway Chess women's tournament, the classical game between co-leaders Anna Muzychuk and Ju Wenjun ended peacefully. However, it was Muzychuk who won the armageddon tiebreak to lead the standings with just half a point ahead of the world champion Wenjunn. ## T20 World Cup: India eye head start against Ireland

fter the gruelling more than two months of Indian Premier League (IPL) action, the Indian stars will return for national duty in their ICC Men's T20 World Cup opener against Ireland at Nassau County International Cricket Stadium here on Wednesday.

The warm-up match against Bangladesh on Saturday must have given them a slight idea of the drop-in pitches on the makeshift New York stadium but the real test awaits them. In the first match of the venue between South Africa and Sri Lanka, the latter were bowled out for 77 which raised eyebrows over the wicket.

The pitch will pose a great challenge for the Indian batters due to its low bounce and slow nature. Apart from the pitch, the game will give the Indian team a real picture of their preparations before taking on arch-rivals Pakistan at the same venue on Sunday.

The biggest question for India before the game is who will open along with captain Rohit Sharma. Will it be Virat Kohli or left-handed batter Yashasvi Jaiswal? Kohli has proved his mettle at the top of the IPL after finishing the tournament as the highest run-getter

while the southpaw and the skipper failed to remain consistent in the cash-rich league.

Other than the opening puzzle, Rishabh Pant is likely to play as first-choice wicketkeeper-batter after his fiery fifty in the warm-up following the blistering IPL season.

However, Sanju Samson has done no wrong to not deserve that place but Pant's unpredictable shot-making gives him an edge over the Kerala batter. Another question for the

## French Open: Djokovic rallies from the brink to beat Cerundolo in fourth-round classic

efending champion Novak Djokovic endured a session with the physiotherapist and many ups and downs to win his second five-set thriller at the French Open on Monday, beating Francisco Cerundolo of Argentina to reach the quarterfinals.

The Serbian looked down and out against Cerundolo when he trailed by two sets to one and a break, conjured up more magic in the French Open as he showed incredible resistance to turn the tide and earn a dramatic 6-1, 5-7, 3-6, 7-5, 6-3 victory.

With this win, Djokovic maintained his chances of reaching the final and holding on to the World No.1 ranking. vear-old, who had hattled

encounter in the third round that finished at 3:07 a.m. on Sunday morning, came back to the court without a few hours and faced another tricky opponent. The Serbian backed up that remarkable victory with another titanic effort against Cerundolo to earn back-to-back five-set victories for the first time since Roland Garros in 2012 when he reached the final.

Despite the late finish against Musetti, Djokovic looked fresh during the opening stages against Cerundolo in the pair's first meeting. However, the top seed tweaked his knee at the start of the second set, and had to take treatment and the issue impaired his movement in the second and third sets, with the Serbian seemingly set to make a shock exit when he trailed 2-4 in the fourth



Despite the deficit, Djokovic refused to surrender breaking back to level at 4-4 before he locked in at the end of the set to force a decider in front of a raucous crowd on Court Philippe-Chatrier In trade

found his best level in the fifth set. He recovered from squandering a break advantage and a fall at 2-1 to triumph after four hours and 39 minutes. Djokovic's 370th major win moves him to first for the most victories at Grand Slam level. Djokovic has reached the quarterfi-

nals at the French Open for the 15th consecutive time. The Serbian, a three-time winner at the clay-court major, will next play Casper Ruud or Taylor Fritz.Djokovic is chasing a record-extending 25th major and must reach the final just to have a chance of remaining No. 1 in the ATP Rankings after the tournament. Second seed Jannik Sinner is guaranteed to become the 29th player in history (since 1973) to rise to No. 1 if he reaches the title mate

Drivers' Championship. The Monaco Grand Prix saw the team make some much-needed changes as they brought a circuit-specific, high-downforce rear wing, a new floor body, and a front wing to Russell's car but not Hamilton's.

"We are looking to have race quantities of that wing [for the next Grand Prix] in Montreal and normally you would say race quantities is at least three because you have got one for each car and then you have got a spare available should anything happen.'
